The Panthers started out right on Friday night when they travelled to Cross Plains for a District 8A battle with the Buffaloes and jumped out to a 7-0 lead in the first quarter but just couldn't score again and finally fell in the last half by a 14 to 7 score with just 1:07 left in the game and couldn't come back due to time.

The two teams exchanged fumbles on their first possessions and the Panthers got a Buffalo misque on the Cross Plains 20 and scored in 5 plays with Adam Rodriguez getting the final yard for the touchdown with 4:51 left in the first period. The drive featured an 8 yard pass to Rodriguez, a 5 yard first down run by Margarita Sanchez and a 5 yard penalty on the Buffs, and a 2 yard run before Rodriguez got the score. Kris Carlton booted the point after and Gorman led 7 - 0.

The score held up through the first half. During the intermission the Gorman Panthers Marching Band performed a very good routine, as well as the Cross Plains Band.

Following the intermission the Buffaloes received the second half kick off on their own 31 and went the distance in 11 plays, helped by two 5 yard penalties on the Panthers, with Leif Hunter scoring from 1 yard out with 7:28 left in the third period. Cory Switzer added the point after kick to the score at 7 - 7.

The game was played on fairly even terms until late in the fourth period. After the Panthers failed on a drive late in the fourth, the Buffaloes took the ball on their own 5 yard line and went the distance in 13 plays with Jarad Richards hitting Dusty Hargrove with a pass that covered 35 yards for the score with only 1:07 left in the game. Switzer added the point after and the Buffs led 14 - 7.

The Panthers took the kick off on their own 11 and could not move the ball as time was running out.

Clark was named to the Honorable Mention List on defense in the Reporters News for his outstanding play. He had 14 tackles, two for losses, and broke up two passes playing at the free safety position.

The Panthers will host the Lometa Hornets on Friday night in the Homecoming Game at Brogdon Field in another important 8A District game. There should be a very large crowd on hand to support the Big Red as the Gorman Exes will be in town for the annual event on Saturday.

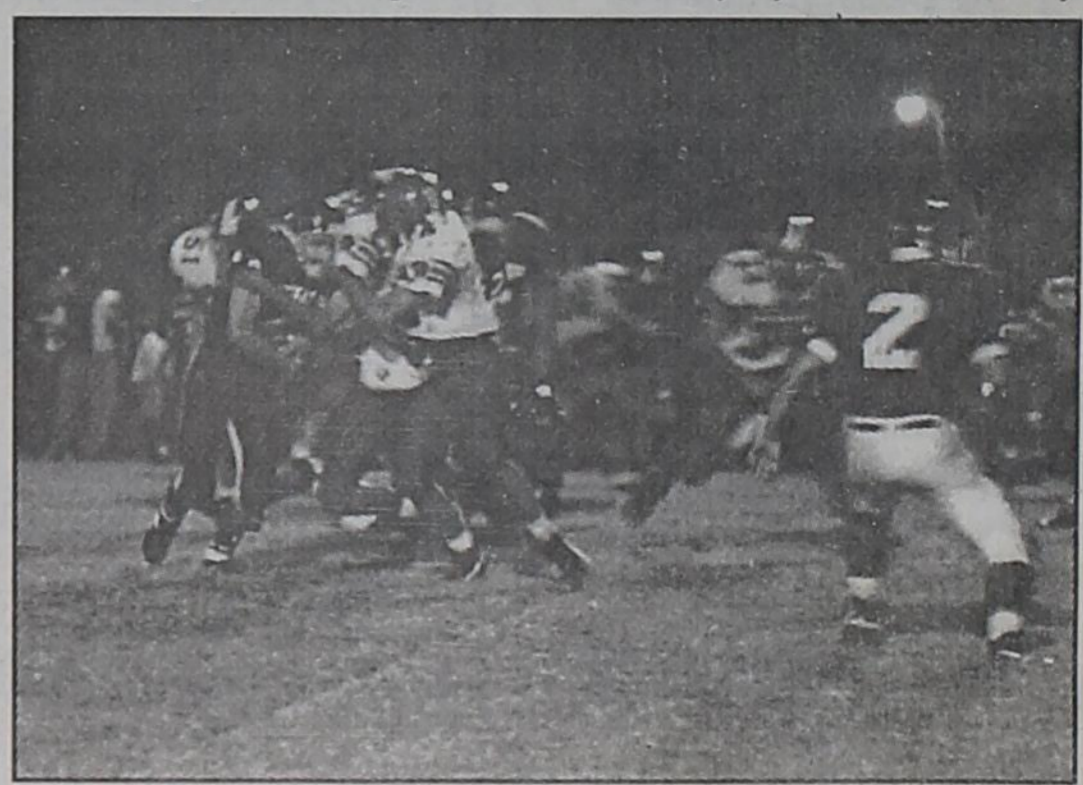

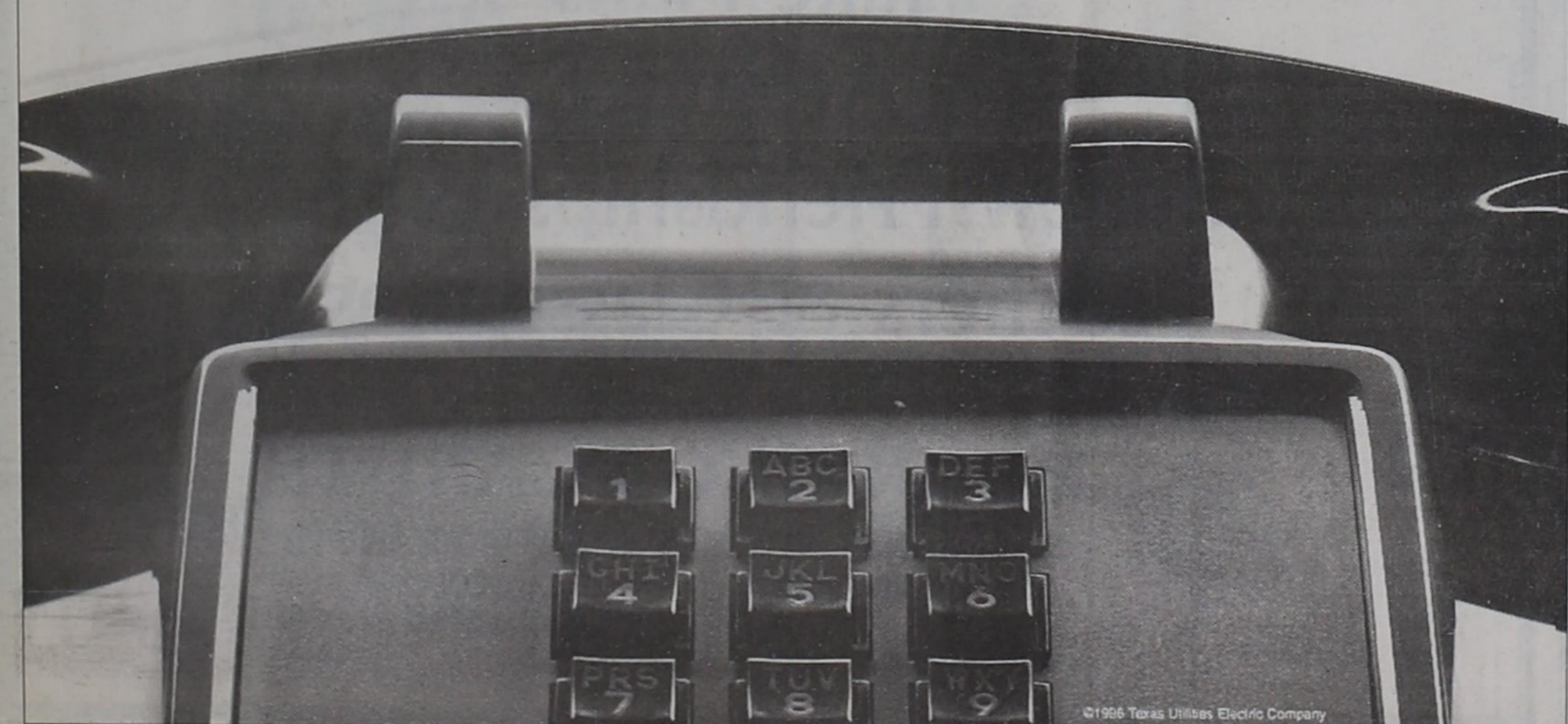

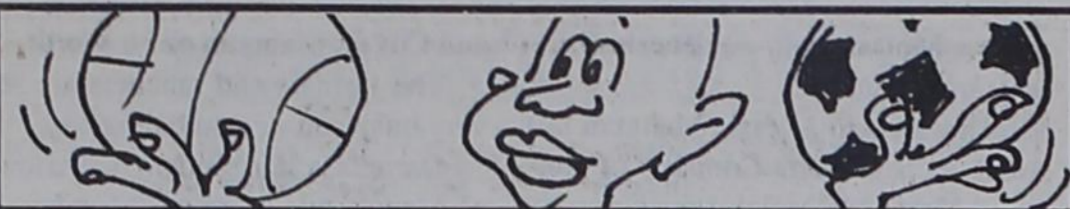

FOR FAMILY AND FRIENDS....

*Does she appear anxious, depressed, withdrawn and reluctant to talk? *Does her partner criticize her in front of you, making remarks that make you feel uncomfortable when you are around the two of them? *Do you see or hear about repeated bruises, or other injuries that reportedly result from "accidents"? *Does her partner try to control her every move, make her account for her time and accuse her of having affairs? *Is there alcohol or drug abuse? *Is she often late or absent from work, has she quit a job altogether, or does she leave social engagements early because her partner is waiting for her?

**Replacement Of
Bridges in Eastland
County Approved**

John Cook announced that eight projects in Eastland County have been

included in the 1997 Unified Transportation Program (UTP) by the Texas Department of Transportation. "The approval of these projects to replace bridges and approaches will allow repairs to facilities that were classified as functionally obsolete or structurally

deficient," said Cook.

The UTP is a ten year planning document that guides transportation project development. It has two elements: Priority One and Priority Two distinctions. Priority One projects are construction projects that are scheduled within the next four fiscal years and Priority Two gives authority for the preparation of plans, specifications, estimates and right-of-way acquisitions.

Eastland County bridge replacement projects ranking a Priority One are 1) County Road 323 at Nash Creek with construction scheduled for 1999 for an estimated cost of \$65,000 2) County Road 494 at South Fork Palo Pinto Creek, construction scheduled for 1999 for an estimated cost of \$125,000, and 3) County Road 408 at Sabana River, construction scheduled for 1997 for an estimated \$153,247. Priority Two projects for bridge replacement are 1) FM 587 at Copperas Creek for an estimated cost of \$25,500; 2) Young street at North Fork Palo Pinto creek for an estimated \$119,000; 3) County Road 290 at Sabana River for an estimated cost of \$113,000; 4) County Road 575 at Warren Lake Creek for an estimated \$108,000; and County Road 156 at North Fork Leon River for an estimated \$114,000.

The Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA) of 1991 restructured the availability of funds for transportation and required the states to develop a Statewide Transportation Improvement Program as a condition to securing federal funds for transportation projects. The eight projects in Eastland County will be 80% federally funded and total \$822,747.

"The approved county projects were in heavy competition with projects from all over the state", said Cook, "and Eastland County residents are fortunate to have had these transportation projects submitted and approved since the Unified Transportation Program considers transportation needs from a statewide perspective", Cook said. "Unfortunately, current funding levels allow TxDOT to meet only about 40% of the identified need", reported Cook, "however, as a member of the Appropriations Committee, I believe we can work in the next Session to see that funding is provided for new farm-to-market roads into the highway system to replace unpaved, hazardous county roads", Cook said.

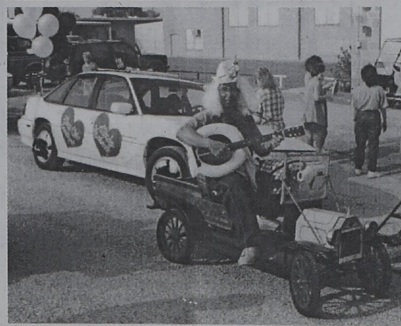
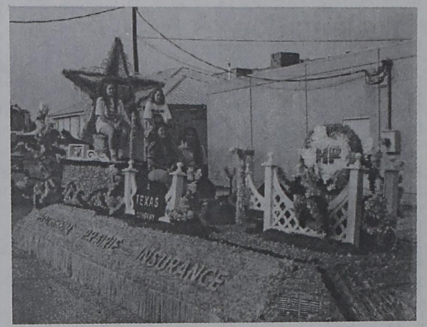
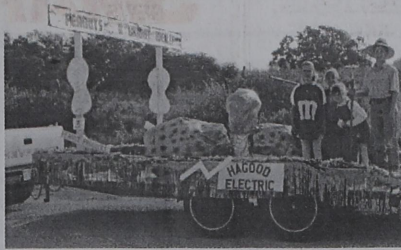
