

Plane Crash Takes The Life Of A Gorman Resident

Gary Ray Wilkins, 47, employed by Zapata Protein USA, Inc. Central Aviation, Abbeville, La. perished in an accident involving a small plane over the Gulf of the Shore, La. Thusday, May 8, 1997. After trouble developed with his plane, he placed a distressed call and immediately lost all contact. Search planes were in the air within minutes. Several parts of the plane along with personal items belonging to him were recovered. Due to bad weather, the search had to be discontinued until the next morning, where once again, numerous search and rescue planes arrived at the accident location to resume rescue efforts. It was Monday, May 12, when the body was found.

Mr. Wilkins was born Sept. 27, 1950 in Bakersville, Ca. He married Sheila Elaine Battenfield Nov. 23, 1974. To this union three children were born; Madelyn 15, Westley 13, and David 9.

The Wilkins recently bought the Dick Gowan farm in Gorman. They planned to build a home there and raise their family. As of this week, all of the paperwork had been completed and they were ready to start building their dream home.

Credit By Exam Test Dates Set In June and July

Credit by Exam for Acceleration will be administered by Gorman ISD on June 26, 27, and 30. Other days of testing are set for July 1,2, and 3. Parents are to register for the June and July administration by Monday, April 28. Parents of elementary students should contact Betty Morris, principal and parents of junior high and school students should contact Linda Glover.

Credit by Exam for Acceleration is a testing program that allows students to accelerate their pace in school by permitting students who have had no prior formal instruction in a course or grade to skip the course or grade. Elementary students must take test in language arts, math, science and social studies at the grade level they are attempting to skip. They must score ninety percent on each of the four tests in order to advance to the next grade. Junior high and high school students must take the test on a semester basis for each class. They too must score 90 percent on each of the tests. Testing must be requested in advance in order for the district to have the tests and must be administered on the announced testing dates.

Early Season Pecan Management Field Day

The Comanche County Extension Commercial Horticulture Committee has planned an Early Season Pecan Management Field Day for Wednesday, May 21. 
The TAAS and TEAMS tests will be offered this July at Gorman High School. By state law, students who are now enrolled in high school must pass all sections of the test in order to receive a high school diploma.

Anyone in the community who has completed all graduation requirement except for passing the TEAMS or TAAS may take these tests to try to earn a high school diploma. A person only has to take that portion of the test that he or she did not pass in high school. Individuals who are no longer enrolled in a Texas public school and who wish to retake a portion of the TAAS or the TEAMS may pick up a registration packet at any high school campus. In Gorman, registration packets will be available in the counselor's office until May 30. After that date, packets will be available in the Superintendent's office. Forms must be completed and are to be received TAAS cont

in Iowa City, Iowa, no later than June 13, 1997.

Students who are currently enrolled in Gorman High School do not need to register for this test.

Persons who have not finished high school and who are interested in obtaining their diplomas, must fulfill the requirements for graduation that were in effect when their class graduated. Therefore, if the TAAS was not required for a person's class, it would not be required today. Texas Tech also has a correspondence program enabling a person to receive a high school diploma through correspondence courses. 




