Gorman, Tx - Fewer Eastland County children are at risk of being killed or injured when traveling on our roadways as a result of Child Passenger Safety Week and "National Seat Check Saturday," Parents and caregivers answered the call for action and brought heir child safey seas to be checked by installation.
"Nearly 3 out of 4 child safety seats are not used properly putting young children in unnecessary risk of being killed or injured," Wayne Dennis, EMTP said. "We're gratified that so many parents and caregivers took advantage of this event to help ensure that their children will be riding safely on every trip, every time.'

Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for children 3 to 14 years old (based on 2006 figures from the National Center for Health Statistics). In 2008 alone, 875 passenger vehicle occupants 14 and younger were killed in crashes.

In 2008, among children under 5 in passenger vehicles, an estimated 244 lives were saved due to the use of child fraints (child safety seats and adult safety belts). If all chilhave been saved. From 1975 through 2008, an estimated 8,959 children's lives were saved by child restraints.

For maximum child passenger safety, parents and caregivers should visit their local inspection stations and refer to the following 4 Steps for Kids guidelines for determining which restraint system is best suited to protect children based on age and size:

1. For the best possible protection keep infants in the back seat, in rear-facing child safety seats, as long as possible up to the height or weight limit of the particular seat. At a minimum, keep infants rear-facing until a minimum of age 1 and at least 20 pounds.
2. When children outgrow their rear-facing seats (at a minimum age 1 and at least 20 pounds) they should ride in forward-facing child safety seats, in the back seat, until they (usually around age 4 and 40 pounds).
(usually around age 4 and 40 pounds).
3 . Once children outgrow their forward-facing seats (usually around age 4 and 40 pounds), they should ride in booster seats, in the back seat, until the vehicle seat belts fit booster seats, in the back seat, until the vehicle seat belts fit
properly. Seat belts fit properly when the lap belt lays across the upper thighs and the shoulder belt fits across the chest (usually at age 8 or when they are 4 ' 9 ' tall)
3. When children outgrow their booster seats, (usually at age 8 or when they are $4^{\prime \prime} 9^{\prime \prime}$ tall) they can use the adult seat belt in the back seat, if it fits properly (lap belt lays across the upper thighs and the shoulder belt fits across the chest).

We gave out 17 seats total during this event. While this may not sound like a lot, it is. This is 17 more children that are now riding safer than what they were before coming to our event. We want to remind people that we still have some

glass pieces are glued to the glass and grouted as a mosaic. They give the appearance of stained-glass.

The Coke piece is a tribute to the newly remodeled art facility at Howard Payne University and the bottles are from real coke bottles shattered. Each semester the students expressed a different topic covered in class in a "hands-on" project.

In other news the ECA board is currently working with Barrett Webb, an Austin architect, with Eastland County connec tions, on the interior design and hopes to have blueprints of the full facility in the very near future.

## City Minutes

SEPTEMBER 16, 2010
The Gorman City Commission met on the above date in a Regular meeting. Those present were Mayor Robert Ervin, Commissioners Durvard Webb, Nathan Files, and Joe Casey. Randy Beyer was present as a representative from the Jacob and Martin Engineering firm. Randy expressed that Gorman had shown interest in extending the water line to the Desdemona residents.
