A PERSONAL MESSAGE FROM JUDGE JIM R. WRIGHT:

Upon my assuming the position of District Judge of the 91st District, I immediately embarked upon a course of action which would result in the increase of the number of cases disposed of.

Cases do not dispose of themselves, but rather are disposed of by hard work, by setting the cases for trial and by actually trying them. A program such as this requires work and time. Such a program requires work not only by myself and the staff of the 91st District Court, but also by the general public as jurors.

On many occasions jurors are called to Court but do not actually serve in the trying of a case. Nevertheless, the jurors who are called fulfill an important role in the administration of justice. Many cases are settled and disposed of civil as well as criminal, without trial just because the case has been called for trial and a jury is present waiting to try the case. Therefore, your work and mine is not in vain because our goal of disposition and justice has been reached.

In the short time in which I have been privileged to serve as your Judge, we have utilized an average of over two jury weeks per month in the administration of justice. The remainder of the time has been used extensively and solely for non-jury matters. We intend to continue our work in this area in an effort to give all parties their day in court. You have a right to expect this from your Court, and will receive no less so long as I am serving you as your Judge.

Many politicians make many promises which they cannot keep. However, one promise that I can and will make and keep is that, if I am elected to continue as Judge of the 91st District Court, the Court will be a working Court and will be one in which cases are tried and disposed of as rapidly as possible in accordance with justice. I am asking you to assist me in my keeping of this promise. Your vote and your support will enable us to continue with the plans and to reach the goals which we all have for the 91st District Court.

4. Hershell N. Cordell is hereby appointed Clerk for absentee voting, and Joyce Cordell and Mike McCormick are hereby appointed Deputy Clerks for absentee voting. The absentee voting for the above designated election shall be held at S. E. C. H. D. Tax Office

within the boundaries of the above named hospital District and said place of absentee voting shall remain open for at least eight hours on each day for absentee voting which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or an official State holiday, beginning on the 20th day and continuing through the 4th day preceding the date of said election. Said place of voting shall remain open between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on each day for said absentee voting. The above described place for absentee voting is also the absentee Clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail shall be sent.

5. By resolution heretofore adopted, this Board of Directors determined that the electronic voting system/voting machines shall be used in the above mentioned election for absentee voting by personal appearance; and in accordance with said resolution and the Election Code,

as Presiding Judge, \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_, as Clerks, are hereby appointed the Special Canvassing Board for said election. Absentee voting, both by personal appearance and by mail, shall be by paper ballots and shall be canvassed by a special canvassing board, and E.G. It is further found and determined that in accordance with an order of the Board of Directors, the Secretary posted written notice of the date, place and subject of this meeting on the bulletin board located in the central administrative office of this hospital district, a place convenient and readily accessible to the general public, and said notice, having been so posted, remained posted for at least 72 hours preceding the scheduled time of said meeting.

It is further found and determined that in accordance with an order of the Board of Directors the Secretary furnished a notice of the date, place and subject of this meeting to the county clerk of Eastland County, Texas, the county in which most, if not all, of this hospital district's voters reside.
