

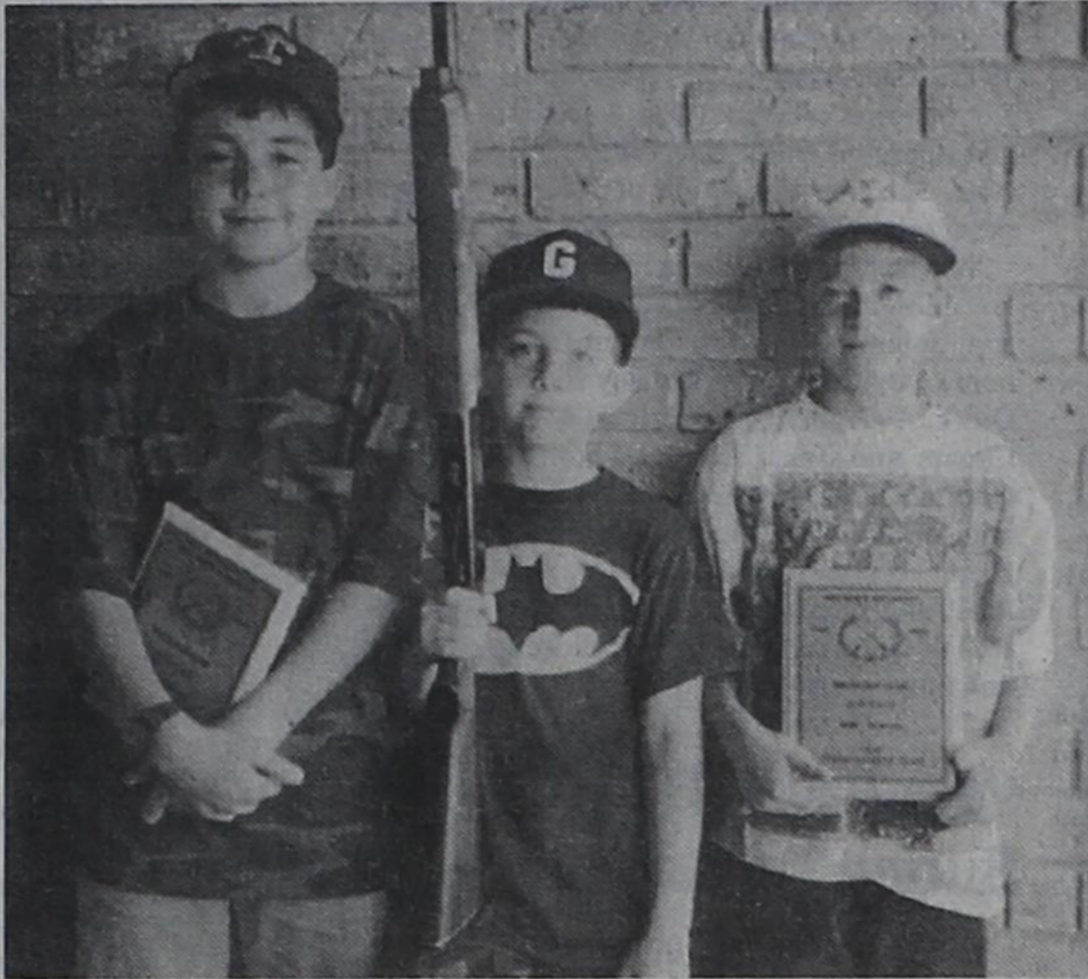

## Local Boys Compete At '93 State 4-H Clay Shoot

The 1994 State meet will be in San Antonio. We are very proud of these boys for doing so well at their first competition. Over 300 shooters entered.

## Gorman Cagers Split Games With Eula

The Gorman basketball teams split games with the Eula teams on Friday night at the local gym. The Panthers defeated the Pirates 45-43 and the Pantherettes were defeated by the Lady Pirates by a 60 to 33 margin.

In the girls action the Eula girls got out to a 10 to 8 lead in the first period, then jumped to a 37 to 18 lead at halftime. The Lady Pirates added 15 and 8 in the final two periods to outdistance the Pantherettes 60 to 33.

Guthery and Campbell led the Pantherettes with 10 points each. Laci Sharp had 7, and Lacy Pack and Michaelyn Eaves each had 3. Baze led Eula with 17.

In the JV game Eula outscored the Pantherettes 45 to 19.

Gorman has a season mark of 6-16 and 0-1 in district.

In the boys action the Panthers jumped out to a 13 to 7 lead in the first period, but fell behind 21 to 20 at the halftime mark. The Pirates outscored the Panthers 14 to 11 in the third period to lead 35 to 31. However, the Panthers came back strong in the final period to outscore Eula 14 to 8 for the 45-43 victory.

Carroll led the Panthers with 9. Caraway and Stephens each had 8. Landa, 7. Mauney, Snider and Posey each had 3. Krause and Bjourson got 2 each. Baze led Eula with 15 points.

Gorman now stands at 12-10 on the season and 1-0 in district.
