



Pare cucumbers and cut in halves, Scoop out seeds leaving a cup. The sweetbreads should be boiled and blanched before dicing. Combine sweetbreads, carrot and peas with mayonnaise to make moist. Fill cu-cumber cups with mixture. Serve on a bed of shredded lettuce and garnish with radish roses and celery curls. The cucumbers should be thoroughly chilled before using.
