

Judge Funderburk To Run For Election In Primaries In July

Judge O. C. Funderburk of East land, who was recently appointed associate justice of the Eleventh court of civil appeals and this morning took the oath of office, announced in a

the oath of office, announced in a statement to the press that he would be a candidate at the coming democratic primaries for election to the position he has been appointed to.

His statement follows:

"I have, of course, not accepted the appointment with the idea of serving only until the next election. If I have any special fitness for the work, I could hardly hope it would become generally apparent in so short a time and I would take too great a chance of losing a good part of my present law practice. My acceptance of the appointment therefore means that I shall ask the people's endorsement at the forthcoming election.

"When an appointment is made to fill out an unexpired term extending beyond a general election, the constitution wisely limits such appointment to the next general election, thus in effect providing that the appointment must then be ratified by electing the appointee or repudiated by electing another. By this means, if any appointee is for any reason objectionable, the qualified voters of the district are given an opportunity to correct the mistake.
"I had hoped that if Governor

Moody honored me with the appointment such exercise of his judgment would be generally approved until my actual record of service should indicate whether the selection was wise or otherwise. I counted on this so much that I did not expect to have apposition in the election and I still opposition in the election and I still indulge the hope that I may be permitted to go to work in peace of mind and undisturbed by a political contest. If, however, this is not to be and I have to contest for that part of the term beyond the election, I shall endeavor to do so in such a way. shall endeavor to do so in such a way as to interfere with the work of the court as little as possible. This means I shall have to depend to a large extent on those who know me and those who do not know me bu are willing to back Governor Moody's judgment as to the fitness of my selection to convince the voters that my appointment should be confirmed."

American Dollar Standard Value In All Countries

By J. W. T. Mason Written for the United Press NEW YORK,—The American dollar has replaced gold as the general basis for world prices and is likely to continue to hold this unique position indefinitely. Reginald McKenna, formerly British Chancellor of the Exchequer and now head of the Lon don Midland Bank, ranking next to the Bank of England, is the first financier of European repute to acknowledge this fact. McKenna has pointed out that America holds 50 per cent of the total gold of the world used for currency, and it is unlikely that this position will be seriously disturbed.

By making dollars instead of gold the basis of world prices is meant that most foreign nations in their in-ternational financial arrangements must discuss balances in terms American curency, rather than their The American dollar has so much gold behind it that it cannot fluctuate very much. Other currencies, however, although nominally on a gold basis, are in possible danger for the most part of losing their gold support should suddenly critical conditions arise.

Thus persons purchasing foreign bonds feel much safer when principal and interest are payable to them in American dollars or the equivalent than when the bonds specify pay-ments only in a foreign currency. Several continental European nation are now on a gold basis. Their cur rency is nominally at par. 
