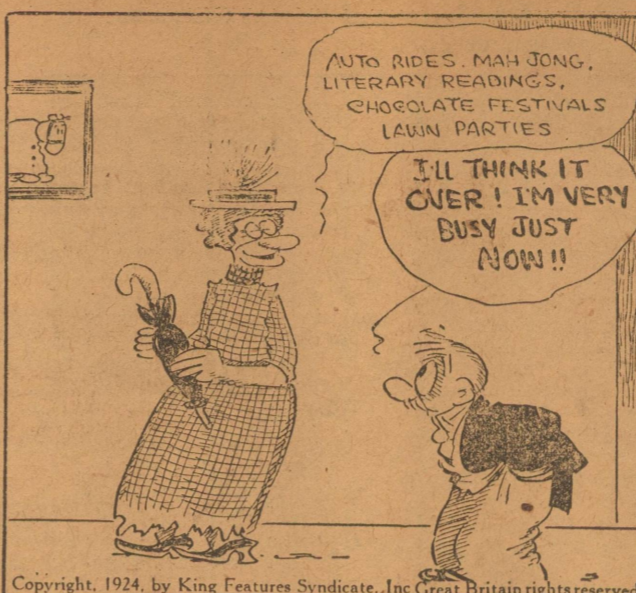
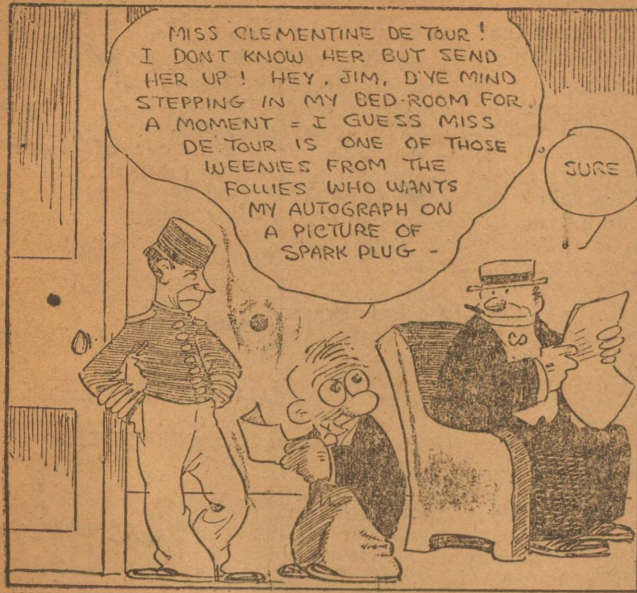

U. S. POLOISTS SHOULD DEFEAT BRITISH TEAM

NEW YORK, Aug. 14.—America's polo four, which will defend the international challenge trophy at Meadowbrook, L. I., next month, rules favorite in the early betting over the invaders from the British Isles.

Man for man, and pony for pony, our team looks to be sufficiently stronger to warrant optimism that the cup which started on a series of trans-Atlantic voyages in 1886, will rest a little longer on these shores.

- No. 1—Eric Pedley, California. No. 2—Thomas Hitchcock, Jr. No. 3—J. Watson Webb. Back—Deveren Milburn.

Three of these poloists—Hitchcock, Webb and Milburn—are veterans of many an international chucker; Pedley is a comparative newcomer, yet we find him at the difficult No. 1 position—a fixture, looked upon to lead the attack, together with the hard-hitting Hitchcock.

Tommy is perhaps the greatest polo player in the world today. As No. 3, Webb earned his place after a struggle. Milburn has no peers as a back.

The British team is strong; the American one stronger; the polo—in which there seems to be a slight increase of popular interest—should be fast and worthwhile. The Prince of Wales is on his way to watch, and there are practically no tickets to be had.

Polo has become a democratic sport in England since the war. Before, only those who were members of the club could watch. Now, anyone, with the price of a ticket, may look on. They call this "playing to gats," something the British poloists would never have thought of doing before the war and prohibition—which showed that some of our best, if not wealthiest, citizens made rattling good polo players, and some of our best polo players unexpectedly turned out to be bootleggers.

AMARILLO TRYING HARD FOR NEXT AMERICAN LEGION MEET

AMARILLO, Aug. 14.—When Amarillo legionnaires go to Brownwood next week, they will carry a "full pack" of reasons why the next state convention of the American Legion should be held in this city.

Aside from attractive climatic conditions and ample entertainment facilities, it is pointed out that Hanson post of Amarillo is among the outstanding units in the state, both as to maintaining membership, and in achievements in behalf of the ex-service men, and that the Panhandle district as a whole maintains a high standard of activities. This record, it is felt here, entitles this section to the honor of entertaining a convention. This is particularly true since no official recognition of this section has ever been given by the state organization.

Eight delegates and probably a dozen visitors will carry Amarillo's message to the Brownwood convention.

THREE DIE DAILY FROM ACCIDENTS IN THE RUHR

BERLIN.—The frequency of accidents in the Ruhr mining district is increasing, the miners union stated in a petition to the local authorities. The increase is due to the disobedience of governmental regulations for the avoidance of accidents by the owners, the union claims. This negligence has made that the number of accidents has been quadrupled during the past eight months so that at present the average number of accidents is 150 per day, with approximately 2 per cent fatal. Since the termination of the passive resistance at least 30,000 accidents occurred in the Ruhr alone.
