Oil Production In California Shows Increase

By United Press. LOS ANGELES, June 22.—Production of crude oil in California in the week ended June 19, averaged 311,500 barrels daily, and increase of 1,000 barrels daily over the preceding week. The increase of 3,000 barrels daily in the Ventura avenue field was offset by a decline of 8,000 in the Los Angeles basin field, which produced 315,500 daily against 323,500. Thirty-seven wells in Los Angeles Corriton districts were killed in order to be deepened, thus reducing the output in the Long Beach field by 2,000 barrels daily. Inglewood showed a similar decline.






