

Two Cardinals Are Appointed By Pope Pius

ROME, June 21.—Pope Pius XI, garbed in a pure white cassock, with all the cardinals present in Rome attending, held a secret consistory this morning in the lavish Hall of Consistory in the Vatican palaces. Unbroken and refined centuries of continuity, the ceremonial was carried out in all its medieval splendor and color.

His Holiness created two cardinals: Monsignor Carlo Perosi, assessor of the Sacred Congregation of the Holy Office, and Monsignor Luigi Capotosti, secretary of the Sacred Congregation of the Sacraments.

Cardinal Gerretti, who was created a cardinal at the last consistory, and is now in Rome to receive the red hat at the public consistory on Thursday, attended his first consistory.

The cardinals gathered in the Hall of Consistory accompanied by their secretaries. There was an array of Swiss guards, papal gendarmes and Palatine guards, while a number of distinguished guests were admitted only to witness the entrance and seating of the Holy Father on his throne. A bell rang and the master of ceremonies invited all those present to kneel for it signified that the pope was approaching surrounded by his court and guard of honor, consisting of Swiss and noble guards.

The pope entered and blessed the assemblage while walking slowly toward the throne. He was seated and gave the sign that the proceedings were ready to begin. The papal majordomo, Monsignor Sanz de Samper, then gave orders for the "extra Omnes", which meant that all strangers must retire leaving the holy father alone with his cardinals.

The doors were closed as soon as all had withdrawn. The pope then delivered an allocution and nominated the two new cardinals. Immediately

two papal messengers were dispatched to the homes of the new cardinals to convey the news. After the ceremony, the pope retired to his apartments.

Recent Primary Gives Woman A Place In Politics

WASHINGTON, June 22.—Recent primary campaigns and other political activities of the last few weeks have developed the place of women in politics.

Even to an extent greater than in the last presidential campaign, women have organized their votes in states throughout the country that their new suffrage might be represented at the polls.

The development was strikingly illustrated in the recent Pennsylvania contest where all three candidates had separate women's organizations with women workers in charge. Senator George W. Linton Pepper, unsuccessful incumbent, claimed to have 8,000 women at the polls as workers on election day in the city of Philadelphia alone. The feminine contingent of the other candidates was smaller in number but the effect of their presence was felt.

Interest among women at the polls ran so high that one quite prominent case was reported to Philadelphia police that a woman working in the interests of one of the senatorial candidates had been set upon by two women working for another candidate with disastrous results to the hair, face and eyes of the three partisans concerned.

Mrs. Clyde B. Aitchison, president of the Political Study Club in a speech here recently said: "Women are seeking facts on national issues, political questions and government politics. To this end they have organized study clubs, and converted the culture clubs of yesterday into organizations dealing with problems which they must face at the polls."

Mrs. Aitchison is working for organization of more study clubs, it being her belief that the first pur-

pose of women in politics is "to obtain first hand information as possible on matters affecting the welfare of the nation, and to learn the opinions of those who are regarded as authoritative."

The United States is still behind some other nations in giving women places in congress. The German Reichstag recently elected, gave 33 women posts out of a total membership of 493.

The house of representatives here has 435 members and only three are women.

The question of how a congresswoman should be addressed by her colleagues on the floor of the house is puzzling parliamentarians a little.

Some time ago Mrs. Julius Kahn of California made her maiden speech; she was recognized by Speaker Nick Longworth as "the gentlewoman from California."

Later when Mrs. John Jacob Rogers of Massachusetts followed with her first effort Representative Snell, acting as speaker pro tem referred to Mrs. Rogers as "the lady from Massachusetts."

In the debate which followed she was referred to as "the gentlewoman" by Representative Dowell of Iowa but as "the lady" by Representative Beeg of Ohio and Blanton, of Texas.

Conversations Resumed Between Two Big Churches

MALINES, Belgium.—Behind the closed doors of the archiepiscopal palace, the world-famous "conversations of Malines" between unofficial representatives of the Church of Rome and the Church of England on a possible basis for rapprochement, were resumed today after a year's interin.

The English delegates, headed by the venerable Lord Coleridge, arrived last night and were driven straight to the palace. They refused to be interviewed beyond reiterating that their visit was "unofficial" and that they had no authority to speak for the Established Church of Great Britain.

The "conversations" will close June 25. They will cover the entire field of church history and theology in an effort to see what stands in the way of reunion. Cardinal Ernest Van Rooy, who succeeded the late Cardinal Mercier as Primate of the Roman Catholic Church in Belgium, issued the invitations for the resumption of the discussion after informal consultation with the Archbishop of Canterbury.
