> AIRWAYS TO SOUTH AMERICA.

Regular trans-oceanic service to South America will come from Europe before it comes from the United States, according to Martin Wronsky, head of the German Airways and a leader in European

Wronsky predicts that Europe will have the advantage of us in this matter chiefly because of more favorable natural conditions.

The German Airways, for instance, plans to install in 1929 a regular airplane service from Spain to Brazil and the Argentine. The long route can be covered handily in a series of short hops via the African coast and the Cape Verde Islands; furthermore, the South Atlantic trade winds blow westward, thus aiding the flight from Europe, while they are not strong enough to hamper the flyers on the return trip.

To offset this, flyers going to Brazil and Argentina from the United States run into bad winds -indeed, part of their route is right through the "hurricane belt" and find other natural disadvantages to make their trip longer and more arduous.

Little interest has been manifested in the United States in air routes to South America. In this matter, too, Europe is ahead of us. For while the Germans are actually preparing to begin operations on their plane service, a diri-



mon sense supports her.

It still remains to be seen, however, whether the foreign govern-ments will be able to block the new tariff rates by diplomatic devices coupled with threats. Great pressure is being brought to bear at foreign capitals by traders who have invested fortunes in the Chinese trade and who do not wish to risk being wiped out.

This is especially so among the Japanese. The Tokio government is being urged by native financiers to refuse to give its consent to abrogation of the old tariff rates. Inder international law, consent of the foreign governments is essential, for treaty rights support the control of the Chinese customs by external powers.

Nevertheless, during the world war, when China was persuaded to war, when china was persuated to enter the conflict on the side of the allies, she was told to break all her treaty agreements with Germany. This was done, over the protest of John Van A. Mac-Murray, now American minister to China, who, at the time was sec-retary of the Pekin legation. 




