DUBLIN, Nov. 13.—The Irish parliament at Belfast for the six northeast counties, is expected to be set up im-mediately, once the home rule bill is passed by the imperial government. There is some agitation for amendments to the financial terms of the homerule bill. Ulstermen are opposed to handing over to any Irish body the con trol of customs and excise. They do not want this privilege for themselves and are determined that it shal not be made available for the rest of Ireland, fearing that it might be used to the detriment of industry in the northern section of the country.

Still Pay Tribute. Belfast men want more than the £1,000,000 to be granted for setting up its proposed new parliament. They also ay that the sum of £18,000,000 which Ireland is to contribute annually to the support of the empire, is too high. This would be reduced by about £3,000,000 a year by the annuities now payable to the imperial treasury by Irish farmers who have purchased their holdings with government advances. This sum is in the future to be divided between th

two Irish parliaments.
One suggestion has been made that funds shall be limited to the Irish in come tax and super-tax, which at present amounts to £10,0000,000 or £11,000,

Outside of Ulster, however, none of these points is being discussed at all. Complete separation and an independent republic is the Sinn Fein policy, while even the moderates demand government for all Ireland on dominion lines as completely free in finance as Canada. The government's bill does nothing to meet this view and its creation of two sparate parliaments in Ireland with equal powers resented by every section of politicians n the south and west.



While the representative character of the gathering will be impaired by the absence of the United States. Germany, Austria and Russia, yet with these exceptions it will come near to represent ing the greater part of the civilized world The session has additional interest as marking the complete organization of the league as provided by the Versailles peace treaty.

Forty-two nations, ranging in importance from the British empire to the republic of Haiti, are expected to send delegates. Of the forty-five states mentioned in the covenant, only three will be unrepresented—the United States, Honduras and Ecuador. Fifteen more nations have applied for admission, and the question of granting them access to the session as new members will be one of the first items of business to be considered. Among these applicants are Austria and Bulgaria of the former enemy states and a number of small nations just emerged into statehood.

The question of admitting Germany to membership will also come under discussion, as it is likely to be raised by several of the former European neutrals, and seems likely that the admission of Mexico may also come before the session All the states seeking membership wi... be required to submit to such regulation of their military, naval and aerial armaments as the league may deem necessary, and the league's permanent advisory commission on military, naval and air questions has been at work since August collecting the data which will be needed by the assembly for proper action on this

The acting president of the assembly M. Hymans of Belgium, will open the first meeting, as the assembly has not yet had a chance to elect a president of its own. This election will be the very first order of business, and will be followed by the election of four vice presidents and the appaintment. dents and the appointment of a committee on credentials.

Enough names of Gelegates are known to show that the absence of monarchy will not detract from the importance of the gathering, although it may reduce it the gathering, although it may reduce its picturesque quality somewhat. Among the more noted figures may be mentioned Dr. Edouard Benes, roreign minister of Czecho-Slovakia and creator of the "Little Entente;" M. #### GEOLOGICAL REPORT SHOWS VARIETY OF TEXAS MINERALS

AUSTIN, Texas, Nov. 13 .- That the state of Texas contains many different varieties of mineral is shown by the mineral collection of the Bureau of Economic Geology and Technology at the Uni-

versity of Texas. In this collection may be found everything from a petrified crocodile skull to a quartz crystal, weighing 706 pounds and said to be the largest in the world, which was mined in Llano county.

Llano county is perhaps the most prolific source of rare minerals in the state, being represented by quartz, sulphide of zinc, galena, pyrite, malachite, thorogummite and srytoloyte. El Paso county is 6-room house, two store rooms, two represented by malachite, sulphite of zinc



STAMFORD, Nov. 13.—The tenor of numerous communications received by the West Texas Chamber of Commerce is to the effect that the wheat aereage for 1921 will be greatly in excess of this year, especially in the Panhandle and plains country. In large areas just below the caprock in the southeastern part of the Panhandle proper cotton will be taboo another year, according to reports. In some cases the decrease from cotton acreage will approximate 50 percent, while the increase in wheat will range from 50 to 100 per cent.


