By United Press. ROCHESTER, Texas, Oct. 25. A posse of several hundred men led by J. S. Tanner, deputy sheriff of Haskell county, searched the countryside today for the slayer of B. W. Hamilton ,a farmer, and his son, Earl, a student in high school. Father and son were shot through the heart on the front porch of their home about 10 o'clock last night.

The family had been asleep when a man in front of the Hamilton home called loudly for Earl.

Mrs. Hamilton was awakened by the shout and inquired concerning the identity of the man.

The stranger told her he was an acquaintance in the neighborhood and that he wished to talk with Earl. The son, accompanied by his father, went out on the porch where there was held a short conversation. The mother heard her son say, "I told them I got it from you." The next she knew,



Contending that the indictment which Thomas Davis was tried murder in connection with slaying of Lucian Shook, September 7, was not a grand jury indictment, motion for the arrest judgment was filed in the 88th listrict court Tuesday by Grisham Bros., attorneys for the deendant. Davis was found guilty as charged and sentenced to

In their motion, defense attorneys declare there is no such or-ganization as "grand jurors" known to the law and that there is no averment in the indictment that it was by a grand jury or that the body of grand jurors was ever organized into a grand jury. The bill of rights is referred to in support of the claim that the failure of the indictment to show a return by such organ-ized body is fatally defective. It s contended that the terms Grand Jurors and Grand Jury are not synonymous in law or fact. The ttorneys insist:

"Wherefore no grand jury of Eastland county, duly organized as such, has ever returned any indictment against this defendant, same should be considered as no indictment, and the defendant prays that for said defect, in substance on the face of said in substance on the face of said in-dictment fully apparent, the judg-ment should be arrested and neventered in this cause.'

Defense counsel also filed motion for a new trial, subject to the motion in arrest of judgment, urging eighteen reasons for a new trial. ...
