Two mothers—weary, broken-hearted mothers—are praying daily with their sons, pleading with God to have "mercy on the baby boys.

Every day since Clyde Thompson and Thomas Davis, alleged slayers of Lucius and Leon Shook, have been confined in the Eastland county jail, two mothers have climb ed the steel stairs to their cells and prayed.

Tears come to their eyes as their sons come to meet them. They sit there—the boys, charged with murder, on the inside, the mothers on the outside of the iron bars.

SCHOLARS SEEK

International Union of Academies Sponsors Gigantic Art Task.

By United Press.

NEW YORK .- Scholars in quest for a knowledge of the past have undertaken to photograph 100,000 antique vases scattered in

museums and private collections throughout the wrold.

So extensive is the task that none but the youngest of the collaborators can hope to witness its completion, according to a report to the American Council of Learned Societies by Mrotimer Graves, assistant secretary of the council.

In a work called "The Corpus Wards of the Council." Vasorum Antiquorum," all existing ancient pottery vases, decorated or plain, the product of Europe, the Mediterranean region, of the Near East, will be reproduced. Since it is impossible to bring the vases together in a single museum, scholarship seeks to provid accurate photographic reproduc tions which may be placed side by side for comparison, Graves says, "Ancient history is no longer


