Sinn Fein Debates Today on Withdrawing Claim of Sovereignty.

By United Press.

DUBLIN, Sept. 19.—Faced with the choice of withdrawing from their insistence upon recognition as sovereign state or abandoning the conference upon which the hope of peace in Ireland rests, the Sinn Fei abinet met today with President Valera. Ireland anxiously awaited the decision. Lloyd George's latest note, received yesterday, in which he insisted that De Valera must with draw his claim for recognition of Ireland as a sovereign state or forfeit the right to a conference, added little to the advancement of the Irish situation, except to further clarify the issues. It was recognized there that the Dail cabinet must go to a conference on Lloyd George's terms, or risk civil war. The press urges acceptance of the British premier's invitation.


