



TOKIO, Nov. 14.-Korekivo Takahashi, minister of finance in the Hara cabinet, has officially assumed the premiership in succession of Takashi Hara, who was assassinated Nov. 4.

The appointment of Baron Takahashi is generally regarded in political circles as a favorable indication of the waning of the power of the militarists and as insuring what is termed as a continuation of the "peaceful foreign policy of Premier Hara."
