The robbers had the pouch and lost it, the railroad men said. *






Cab Hurled 1,000 Feet When Freight Engine Blows Up East of Abilene.


The cab was blown 1,000 feet from the boiler and the entire engine is a total wreck. It was pulling a freight train when the explosion occurred. All three of the men lived at Big
