NEA Service Writer. WASHINGTON .- When the Hon. Dwight Morrow arrives in Mexico as our new ambassador the chief mat-ters which will occupy his interest will be:

1-The Mexican oil land laws. 2-The payment of interest on Mexican bonds held in this country and abroad.

3-The Mexican presidential elec tion.

All these problems are more or less tied up with each other and are of considerable interest to the people of the United States.

If the Mexican supreme court de-cides the laws are not constitutional, the issue will be dead. But if it de-cides the other way and the Calles government seizes American property it is still likely that the arms embargo will be lifted and that Mexico will, by design, be plunged into chaos.
