By United Press. MOSCOW, Dec. 17.—In a tem-perately worded note that contained a criptic hint of "ensuing conse-quences" soviet Russia today protested against the Chinese nationalist government's severance of diplomatic relations. It denied any complicity i na revolt of radicals who seized Canton.

Strangely, one ground for protest was that Russian consuls were in na-tionalist territory under agreement with the northern anti-bolshevik and conservative government at Pekin. "Russia never had recognized the na-tional or other local governments," the note said.

This plea meant that Russia repudiated a government which Rus-sian communists had supported open-ly against that of Pekin and to which the Russian government had been most friendly.


