4—Corruptly contracted for the services of Kirby Fitzpatrick as a

state banking department attorney, paying Fitzpatrick \$3,500 before the attorney discharged any

duty.
5—Unlawfully issued a \$7,900 deficiency certificate to create positions not authorized by the legislature.

6—Feloniously conspired with one May Kline and one Mamie Hammonds (Mrs. O. O. Hammonds) and extorted from C. B. McCormack a highway contractor, \$1,412 in return for the payment of a claim McCormack held against the highway commission.



Herd Employes Into Vault

Robbers Hurry Out of Town Going Toward Gorman in Chevrolet Touring Car; Belief Expressed That Woman Served As Lookout and Aid Bandits

The First State bank of Carbon, 10 miles south of Eastland, was robbed by two unmasked bandits who entered the bank just after 12 o'clock Tuesday, scooped up all the cash in sight and herded the bank employes and several customers into the

The bandits did not lock the vault door and the alarm was given in ample time for citizens of the town to see the bandits make their escape. They are said to have fled south ward Gorman, driving a Chevrolet touring car. First estimates were that the robbers secured \$5,000 in

money from the bank. It was said that most of the bank's cash was out of the vault and the bandits made practically a clean sweep of everything in sight. The sheriff's office at Eastland was immediately advised of

the robbery and officers were sent in search of the fleeing The robbers who appeared to be young, apparently about 35 years of age, worked rapidly.

Belief was expressed that the bandits changed automobiles shortly after they got out of sight of the bank. Shortly before the robbery a woman was noticed driving slowly by the bank in a high-powered car. It was said she had not been seen in the town since the robbery. Her description is said to tally with that of a woman who is alleged to have aided in other bank robberies in Texas. This information was supplied by officers from Dallas shortly after news of the robbery was received.

Eight persons, three of them employes, were said to have been in the bank at the time of the holdup. Among the officers and employes who were herded with customers into the vault were Dr. Rumph, Elbert R. Trimble and W. L. Trimble.

Whiteker's plan is that congress pass an act requiring all gins to use cotton bagging. This would create a new and permanent demand for from 350,000 to 500,000 bales of cotton of that low grade that depresses the market most when a large carry-over is necessary, the West Texas official

Figures show that the American cotton farmers have spent within the last three years some \$75.000.000 for a foreign-grown commodity in which to wrap their cotton crop, while at the same time, the cheaper grades of American cotton suitable for this use were dragging down the market for want of demand. To wrap last year's cotton crop cost the farmers of the United States \$25,000,000 and probably every bale except round ales was drapped in jute from India. his jute costs from 12 to 12 1-2 ents per pound or \$1.50 per pattern 12 pounds, and at the same time.
