Guaranty State Bank Of San Angelo Is Battle Scene

By United Press. SAN ANGELO, Dec. 9.—Believed SAN ANGELO, Dec. 9.—Believed to have become momentarily insane from worry, Karl Word, cashier of from worry, Karl Word, cashier of the Guaranty State bank, located in the San Angelo business district, shot and probably fatally wounded William Schneeman Jr., president of the bank, seriously wounded Ira Swope, assistant cashier, and then turned the gun on himself. Word will die, physicians said.

Word made a statement to District Attorney P. I. Durham after the shooting. Durham withheld the statement pending further investigation.

The shooting occurred at noon in the front office of the bank. An unidentified woman customer was wounded but will recover. Swope ran to the street and fell with a bullet through his left hip. The woman was believed to have been hit by a stray bullet.

Investigation disclosed the pistol on

Investigation disclosed the pistol on Word's desk had been fired four times. According to investigating officers, it had been rumored that Swope was to be elevated to the position of cashier. Swope, Schneeman and Word were seen talking together at Schneeman's desk. A moment later four shots rang out.

Walter Probst, a witness, said he ran to Word's desk and saw a .45-calibre pistol under Word's hat.
Word was slumped into unconsciousness. He had a bullet wound through his chest.




