DENVER, Nov. 21.—Two striking miners were killed and at least 10 I. W. W. and state police wounded in a clash between the two forces at the Columbine mine early today, according to reports to authorities

The fight followed when 500 of the striking miners and their wives, dressed in overalls rushed a force of

15 state guards in an attempt to picket the property.

Immediately after hearing of the pitched battle, William H. Adams ordered the national guard mobilized for immediate entry into the strike game.

Martial law probably will be de-clared in the northern field later in the day Governor Adams said.
