Chief of Police Byron B. Parrish apeared before a full meeting of the board of commissioners in the city offices Tuesday af-ternoon and was called on to explain open gambling in Ranger.

"Gambling houses are running again and for the past week have been running without restriction of any kind. The houses are open, in spite of assertions made when they were closed recently and without any apparent effort on the part of the chief of police to stop them," said Mayor M. H. Hagaman.

"If the chief, the city manager, or police commissioner can give any answer, we'd like to know. "If anyone doubts the conditions, we have the testimony. The proof is at hand."

In responding, Chief Parrish admitted that gambling houses had opened last week and said that he had knowledge of one open Thursday and learned of two Saturday. He said that he had closed them Sunday night. He said that he had lacked co-

operation from the commissioners, and that the open cabaret had complicated his problem.
"Close the cabarets and I'll close gambling," he offered!

His explanation failed to satis fy Commissioners M. R. Newham and T. F. Deffebach, who directed a few questions in regard to the chief's knowledge of the open houses.
"I suggest that you resign," saidMr. Newham.

"It's come to a condition where you will either have to quit or we will. The decent citizens say that can't stay in the town.' Chief Parrish responded that

he was right, that he was able to close the gambling houses and that in thirty days he would prove it to the commissioners. The suggested resignation was

put in the form of a motion, but before action was taken, Chief Parrish was excused and the matter was discussed by Mayor M. H. Hagaman and Commissioners R. M. Davenpart, A. Davenport, Newham and Deffebach.

They agreed that the explanation of open gambling, running as one commissioner described it, "as it did in Mexico," was not satisfactory, but the advisability of leaving the police department without a head also was consid-

"It is getting so rotten, so vile, so stinking in Ranger that I would be ashamed to have a friend visit the city and know that I was one of the commissigners," said another of the body. Further discussion of the question was postponed at 7 p. m. until this afternoon.
