### GOLD MINING SUFFERS

The familiar saying to the effect that somebody has a regular gold mine, referring to a very profitable business or investment, doesn't mean anything nowadays. The h. c. of I. has dealt the gold mining industry a staggering blow.

Gold has a more or less fixed value. An ounce of the yellow metal is worth about the same amount now as several years ago. But the cost of mining gold, according to reliable figures, has increased in some instances 400 per cent. The result is that many large companies operating in Colorado and other western states, and in Alaska, have closed their mines, and in some cases removed the costly machinery. In other cases the pumps have been stopped and salt water has ruined the mines. Still other large concerns are operating at a loss, in an effort to hold their machinery and organizations together.

Colorado has felt the effects of this situation most acutely. A traveller from Leadville recently stated that mines there were shut down or working a small force at a financial loss. During the war many experienced miners volunteered or were drafted into the army, and the mines had to employ inexperienced help. Demobilization scattered these men to the four corners of the compass. Many who did return found their old occupation gone.

Several remedies have been proposed to meet the situation; a bonus of several dollars an ounce was one suggestion advanced. Government aid has been suggested, but nothing definite has been done in the matter so far.

### RESUMING RUSSIAN TRADE.

The action of the allied government perfecting plans for the lifting of the trade blockade against Russia is apparently a move in the right direction, although the political possibilities it holds cannot be determined just at this time. Russia holds vast stores of commodities badly needed by the allies, and with their release the world market will be flooded and prices thereby be forced down.

The free interchange of manufactured goods and raw materials between the Russian people and the allied nations will be the means, it is asserted, of bringing about a better stabilization to the world market. Through this means, not the least of which to the people themselves of Europe, will be the lowering of food prices, about which, just as in America, there has been a great hue and cry. Possibly also the lifting of the blockade will mean the downward turn of prices in America, in respect to wheat, flax and lumber. Whether the entire range of prices in American commodities will be directly affected is of course a question of doubt, but that the removal of the blockade will serve to put the trade of the world on a more stable basis cannot be gainsaid.

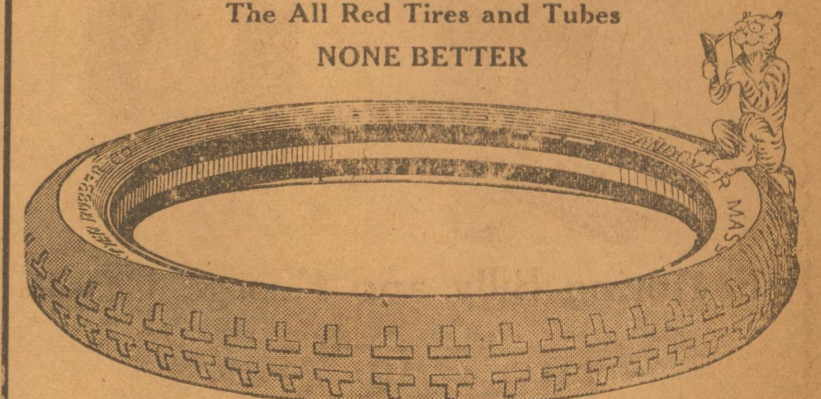

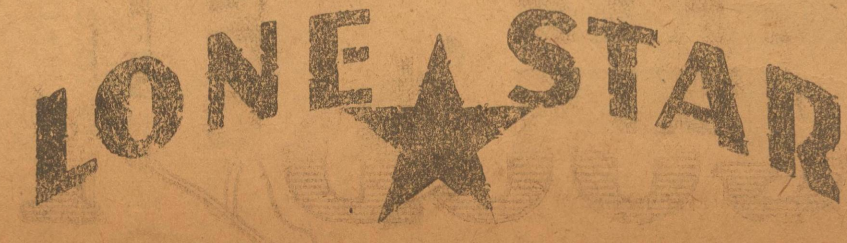

# JUDGE STARNES APPROVES SELF DETERMINATION

No steps will be taken in the good roads program relative to roads from Ranger without full conference with Mayor Hagaman, city officials and representatives of the Chamber of Commerce.

Location of all roads will depend on directness of route, engineering recommendations and economy of construction. As far as possible self-determination of local questions will be used in routing roads through cities and towns.

Ranger stands behind Judge Starnes of our county court, approves his work to date and the policies he outlines.

These are facts which stand out from the conference of Judge C. R. Starnes with city officials and directors of the Chamber of Commerce Tuesday afternoon in the Chamber of Commerce. City officials told of the surveys that have been made by the crews working from Ranger, Gorman, Rising Star and Eastland. One survey from Ranger has been completed—that of the road east to the county line.

"No road is as yet located definitely. Surveying work, which we knew would be costly and slow in the winter time, now is going ahead as rapidly as it can be pushed. The question of mileage, in most cases, will be considered with that of economy."

"In regard to the east and west road, the Bankhead highway, which may be considered the most important road in the United States, I agree with Mr. Mitchell of the Texas & Pacific railroad, that it should be located through the best part of the city—that Ranger may put its best foot forward."

"The government has already furnished us with \$100,000 worth of equipment, and will furnish another \$100,000 worth, loaned to us for the duration of our roadbuilding campaign. We are able to get \$85,000 governmental aid in cash and possibly may get \$250,000. This brings our total program to \$5,000,000 and allowing five per cent for engineering and inspection, leaves \$4,750,000 to build roads."

"The location man approved by the committees from each community and passed at the election, gives a general idea of the location of the roads. If we are not legally bound by this man I feel morally bound by it."

"Stone & Webster and Stowe Bros. have signified their intention to bid on the whole job. We plan to ask for bids that cover all or any part of the work and reserve the right to accept all or any part of the bids. Major Holman, who may be identified with Stowe Bros. in the contract, has estimated that 65 per cent of the program may be completed in 1920 and the remainder in 1921."

As to the question of the road south to Desdemona, a vital one to Ranger interests, Judge Starnes held that the man would determine that road's location, unless engineering recommendations changed it. This question was brought up by Ralph G. Stockman, who pointed out the advantage in cost and directness of the ridge route. The Ranger men rested the question on the decision arrived at from a fair survey and cost estimate.

Putnam Learned, chairman of the Chamber of Commerce roads committee, after Judge Starnes' statement that a full hearing would determine all road locations, offered a resolution of appreciation of Judge Starnes' visit, his work and his program, which passed unanimously.

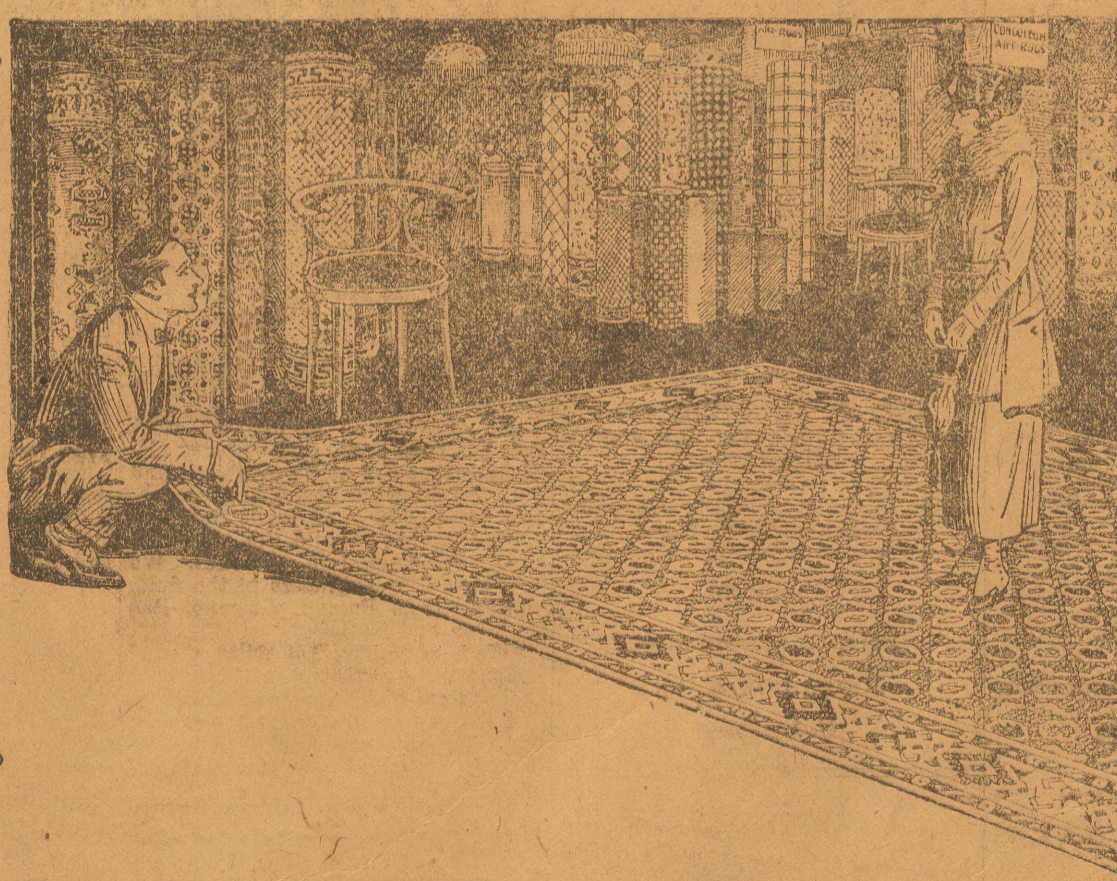
