PARIS, France, May 25.—The entire chamber of deputies, with the exception of the communists, gave Premier Poincaire a great ovation today when he entered the chamber for further interpellations on the Ruhr. The communists hooted, but this only ncreased the enthusiasm of the dep-

Premier Poincaire resigned Thursday evening.

M. Poincaire decided to withdraw when the senate, sitting as a high court for the trial of Marcel Cachin, and other communists, charged with acts endangering the safety of the republic, voted by a majority of 30 that it was incompetent to bring the defendants to trial.

Lids On Oil BRITISHFLEET Wells Will Be Closed Down

Operators In Mid-Continent Field to Lessen Production Until

By United Press

TULSA, Okla., May 25 .-Temporary shut-down of all oil wells in the Mid-Continent oil field was agreed to here today at a meeting of representatives of oil production companies.

Operators agreed that 279 wells now being drilled in Osage and Kay counties would be ordered plugged at the top of the oil bearing sands.

The action taken here today was said to be unanimous and is expected to have the support of the oil men in all the major pools in Oklahoma in order to curtail production.

"The lid is to be clamped down until the consumption of crude petroleum warrants the resumption of drilling," said E. R. Perry vice president and general manager of Cosden & Co.



NEW DO'S AND DON'T'S

The psychology of childhood seems to be one of the last things that the wise men have been able to learn. That they are coming into the knowledge at last, even though the process has been slow and painful, is proved by the way in which the youthful point of view is grasped by the American Child Health association. In the comprehensive program of child health and child conservation drawn up by some of the leading experts of the country and of the world-for the Association boasts Herbert Hoover as president, and internationally PURE WATER known physicians and welfare officials are on the board—a very modern wisdom and a remarkable understanding of childhood are shown.

The old adult idea that children should do unpleasant things simply Seventy per cent of the milk because they are good discipline finds no place in the outlined doctrines of the American Child Health association. Arbitrary "Don'ts" tried and found wanting in child control The Sanitary Dairy through so many hundred years, are omitted from the health plans of the association. Games are substituted for cut-and-dried commands, enjoyment for dull rules, and an understanding of the fruits of wholesome living in place of fear of punishment.

In the old physiologies, health used to be taught largely through fear of the grom bugaboo disease, rather on the order of the old-fashioned school teacher, ready to pounce upon such children as did not obey his mandates, and punish them. Inevitably, the youngsters arrived at the conclusion that the really important thing was not to get caught. But in the new health program of the American Child Health association, health is portrayed to the child not as a stern dragon, but as a desirable playmate. Children are urged to do the things that will keep them well and strong, not with threats of the unhappy fate that will otherwise overtake them, but with the promises of the enviable future that will be theirs if they are comrades with health. The boys will be robust; the girls will be more attractive if they are strong; both boys and girls will be able to have an infinitely better time.

For the very little children in the schools there is even a health fairy, who adds the neverto-be-disobeyed mandates of the fairies themselves to the instruction she brings about health. There is a Jolly Jester all in white, with cap and bells, who is able to make the children laugh, and so remember advice about the milk and eggs and open windows. Even to the older youngsters the health talk comes with a pleasant accompaniment of gaiety and good cheer. Naturally, along with all this merriment, there is a thorough-going and comprehensive program of health, including sound information and training in health habits, planned for the child at every stage of his development, from before birth until he is ready to enter the business or college world.


