Former Arctic Explorer Hears His Effusions Presented to Federal Jury.

FORT WORTH, Oct. 18-Government prosecutors provided periods of humor for the spectators in the trial of Dr. Frederick Cook and his associates, charged with using the United States mails to defraud in the sale of oil stocks, by reading from letters and circulars alleged to have been sent by Cook and his associates to prospective purchasers, urging them to buy stock in oil companies they were promoting.

One letter introduced by a witness was from Cook and those with him in the Petroleum Producers association in which it was said the company would take a place conspicuous in history.

Another circular said the former Arctite explorer had never wandered from the ideals instilled in him in his infancy and childhood and that now "I feel that I have landed on safe shores with a cargo of riches."

Convention Now Shaping Up Policies for Next Year and Will Enlarge Influence.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 18.—An avalanche of work descended today on the fifth annual convention o the American Legion. Practically every committee has completed its report and placed before the conven tion the task of formulating its policies for the ensuing year. It is said the legion will not abandon any of its national policies; but that all will be reiterated and many of them on a more general scale.

Discussion of the Ku Klux Klan and of prohibition are not expected to reach the floor of the convention The resolution bearing on the Ku Klux Klan is expected to come up for final action by the committee today. The resolution does not mention the klan, it is claimed, but condemns any secret order using masks as part of the ritual or fostering ectionalism, racialism or religious ifferences.

Denial has been made by chairman of the committee that the committee had agreed by a vote or 21 to 20 to bring the resolution to the floor of the convention. Texas and Oklahoma delegates are said to have supported the klan.






