Senator Robinson said the pledge of the democrats also was given that al proposals for the adjustment of international peace would be considered without partisanship.



In the year ending November 30, H. R. Bush, Eastland county agent, conducted 516 farm demonstrations, with a stotal attendance of 6,726 persons, according to his annual report, completed Saturday. In the same period, Miss Ruth Ramey, home demonstration agent, conducted 548 meetings with a total attendance of 9,666 persons, according to Bush's report. These figures give faint idea of the

amount of work done by the cunty agent's department during the year. To cover his 516 demonstrations and other work, Bush traveled a to. tal of 8,133 miles in the year and

Miss Ramey went almost as far. The county agent visited 165 farms, 210 homes and received 985 office calls, a tota! of 1,360 visits during the year. He organized clubs among 700 men, 124 boys and 326 girls. Poultry Culling

Chief among Bush's activities for games and lost as many. the year was culling and other work 000 birds, showing a profit and saving of \$20,000. The 10,364-egg hatcheries were installed at Cisco and at Rising Star.






