# Ranger Water Works System Found to Have an Appraised Value of \$157,628

While All Declared Desirable, Some May Be Deferred For Period.

Improvements recommended in the properties of the Ranger water works, including replacements in the distributing system, new stand pipe and a filtration plant, with the estimated cost of extensions, are included in the report of the Elrod Engineering company of Dallas, which was presented to the Ranger city commission last night by J. D. Shaw, engineer, who made the survey.

The improvements were detailed in a booklet, a copy of which was presented to both the city commissioners and Eastland Retail Merchants Asthe Ranger Water Works company. The proposed improvements would cost \$72,661.10,

Eighth District, Comprising Thirteen Counties, Will Center in Eastland, Where Engineer in Charge Will Have His Home.

A telegram Wednesday night from L. S. Earley, of Austin, chief engineer of the Eighth district of the Texas highway department, said that he would be in Eastland Friday to make final arrangements for opening district headquarters here.

As announced by this news-Raper, the state highway department, Wednesday, announced its final decision, making Eastland headquarters of the Eighth district, made up of 13 counties. Cisco was a bidder for this honor and it required hard work to land the headquarters for East-

BERLIN, Nov. 22.—Germany has een vastly relieved by the nature of the notes agreed upon at the meeting of the ambassadors' council in Paris yesterday, it was said here today. Those notes deal with the restoration of military control in Germany under the terms of the Versailles treaty and the return of the former crown prince to Germany from his retreat in Holland.

The agreement on the text of the note represents some important French concessions to Great Britain. For instance, neither in the case of the crown prince nor the restoration of allied military supervision is there any mention of specific sanctions against Germany in case she does not comply satisfactorily with the allied demands.

Ranger for some years to come Should a greater capacity be needed, it could be cheaply obtained by adding more filter beds, Shaw said. The sedimentations basins will care for more than 2,000,000 gallons per day. A copy of the plans for the enlargement of the plant accompanied the

The installation of additional pump and engine with a capacity of 600,000 to 750,000 gallons per day, including the removal of present pumping equipment to new building, would cost \$8,000.

The installation of a 1,000,000gallon filtration plant to be installed in connection with the present sedimentation tanks, and with sufficient space to house all pumping equipment would mean an outlay of \$25,000.

A 250,000-gallon steel or concrete reservoir complete on foundation would mean a cost of \$10,500 not including the site.

There would also be a cost of about 5 per cent for engineering and supervision, or \$3,460. The above figures for improvements total \$72,661.10.
