Prints of Twins Are Not Similar Says Detectives

LONDON .- Scotland yard has emphatically refuted claims made by a phatically retuted claims made by a local professor that the finger prints of twins are often similar. No such instance has ever been discovered in the history of the finger print system, it is said.

German, Dutch and Swiss police authorities quickly wrote to Scotland Yard asking information of the report from England of the similari-

land Yard asking information of the report from England of the similarity of the finger prints of two twins and pointing out that if the professor was correct the whole system of police identification was threatened. Scotland Yard has replied that the professor, William Crowther of University college, was mistaken.

Prof. Crowther said that twins often showed a resemblance not only in

ten showed a resemblance not only in build and size and shape and appearance but in blood pressure and finger prints. He cited the case of two twins, George and Edward Ellis, whose finger prints, he said, were

similar.

Sir Wyndham Childs, assistant commissioner of police and head of the criminal investigation department of Scotland Yard, proved that the professor was wrong. He said that the Yard had dealt with over four million finger prints and no two had ever been found alike.

"Although the formation of the fingers of the twins resembled each other in many respects, when it came to the finger prints they were totally dissimilar. You cannot split straws; finger prints are alike or they are not alike. 


