It ought not be necessary for a farmer to have to buy his breakfast food from Battle Creek, his pork from Chicago, and his butter from Elgin,

The county and home demonstration agents are doing a great work to bring this about. The farm agent aids the tiller of the soil in his work of diversifying and in the preparation and cultivation of his soil so that he can have more than one money crop. The home agent aids the women by teaching them how to can their surplus for times when it is needed.

The farmers of Texas must do this, and when they do diversify, and raise their own supplies then there will be little need of McNary-Haugen and other bills for relief. The production of home supplies and diversification coupled with curtailing the acreage planted in cotton soon will put the farmer in position to ask his price for his products. He will be able to market it as the world needs it.

FARM TERRACING.

County Agent R. H. Bush should be commended for his work in showing the owners of land how they can prevent erosion and build up its ferbility by terracing. In Eastland county may be found a large acreage that could be made highly productive if terraced.

The man who terraces his land not only builds for himself but for future generations. There is nothing prettier in the late spring and early summer than to see a well cultivated farm,

one that is terraced. The work that is being done by Bush and others along that line is not sufficiently appreciated. The cost of terracing is small when compared with the results that will be obtained. One thing the farmer must do to get the full benefit of terracing and that is to keep up the terraces. 


