RUSSIA'S MIGHT IN MANCHURIA IS THING OF PAST

By United Press. By United Press.

HARBIN.—With the liquidation of the Russo-Asiatic Bank disappears the last remnant of economic might of Old Russia in Manchuria. Formed in 1895 with Russian state funds and French private capital, the Russo-Asiatic Bank, it was intended to serve on one hand the imperialistic designs of Russia in her push towards open ports in the Pacific, and on the other to foster economic relations with the foster economic relations with the

he Far Eastern countries. Through its medium the railway nain lines in Manchuria were built, the southern part which reverted to Japan in result of the Russo-Japan-

ese war.

The Bank reached its height of prosperity during the period preceding the Russian revolution. It had over 30 branch offices in Russia, China, and abroad, and fulfilled the functions of a state bank. It obtained and managed concessions, issued the custody. its own money and had the custody of Russian and Chinese state funds. Nationalization

The Bank's decline began with the nationalization of banks in Russia after the October revolution. Having lost the support of the Russian Ministhe support of the Russian Ministry of Finance and having suffered a severe drawback by the loss of its properties and funds in Russia, the bank since then had to rely on the operations of its Far Eastern branches especially on those of North Manshavia

By an agreement concluded at Pek ing in 1920, with the Chinese govern ernment the bank obtained practical a full control of the maangemen the railway, but had to spend a reat amount of money in order to estore the railway which was badly isorganized during the revolution eriod, to a working condition. Barely aving accomplished this, the railway was taken away from the bank by the Mukden-Soviet agreement of 1924. Since then all railway funds were withdrawn from its custody and the work of the Harbin branches of the Pusso Asiatic Bank became practical. Russo-Asiatic Bank became practically nil.

At the same time in Paris, where the board of the bank is situated, the misunderstanding which were going on for a long time between the Rus-sian and French group of sharehold-ers came to a deadlock, on account of

In connection with this, it is stated from authoritative sources that the liquidation of the bank is not a voluntary one, but has been ordered by the French government, which was unwilling to see the control of the bank pass into Soviet hands. As another reason for the liquidation its




