NINTH DISTRICT LEAGUE AT STEPHENVILLE APRIL 15-16

The ninth district interscholastic league meet will be held in Stephenville at John Tarleton college Friday and Saturday, April 15 and 16. The first day's program consists largely of declamations and debates elimination contests in the various events, with the finals on Saturday. The boys' and girls' preliminary debate will be held in the First Baptist church at 10 a. m., after registration at John Tarleton college at 9:30 o'clock. Finals in boys' and girls' extemporaneous speaking will be held in John Tarleton college auditorium at 8 o'clock that night. The declamation contest, rural boys' and girls, 10 a. m., in the First Methodist church, high school boys' and girls', 1:30 p. m., Methodist church. First and second place winners in

each of the eight divisions in declamation are entitled to participate in the district contests. The 3-R contest.

At 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon of Friday tennis preliminaries will be held for boys and girls, and the finals on Saturday.

The following are the rules for the district track and field meet Saturday:

The rural pentathlon will be run off Friday afternoon at 2:30.

Preliminaries in the 100, 220, high hurdles, low hurdles, and possibly 440 start promptly at 9 Saturday morning. Coaches meeting at 8:30 Saturday morning.

Finals start promptly at 2 Saturday afternoon.

First, second, third, and fourth place winners in the county meet, class A and B, are eligible to compete in any five events, only three running events including the relay, in the district. Qualification in the relay race is by schools, not by individuals, therefore a team of any four men may be used at the next higher meet. No individual on this team is eligible for other events unless he qualified in some other event or events at the preceding meet.

County directors must report immediately the first, second, third and fourth place winners and the schools they represent. Some directors have reported the names of the winners but not the school the winners represent, others reported only first place winners.

Entries must be in not later than the night of April 12, Tuesday.

A man can enter only one of the following events: 440, 880, or one mile run.

The fact that a man placed in an event in the county does not enter him in the district for that or any other event. The coach or teacher must send in a separate entry blank for the district meet.

Send entries to W. J. Wisdom, or Oscar Frazier, Tarleton Station, Stephenville, Texas.

Medals for first and second place winners only will be provided.

Texas Tech Gets Summer School Appropriation

Special Correspondence.
LUBBOCK, April 8.—Official information from the governor's office has just been received at Texas Technological college that the appropriation of \$47,350 which was asked for the summer school has been allowed in full. At the same time an emergency appropriation of \$66,626 was also granted, which will, according to President P. W. Horn, make it possible to round out the present fiscal year in good shape.
School authorities are particularly pleased at Tech over the receipt of the news of the full appropriation for the summer school. This will enable them to carry out the plans for a 12-weeks session which is to open June 7 and close Aug. 27. This period will be divided into two terms of six weeks each.
Practically all of the regular faculty will remain as instructors during the summer, including the four deans and 16 heads of departments. In addition several experts have been added to the faculty, including instructors in the problem project method, primary methods, and other subjects. The plains climate is being heralded as the coolest in Texas during the summer months.
