



# Brown County Is Big Producer

The J. W. Shore lease in Brown county assumed the center of the oil stage today with a good increase in production despite the threatened cut in the price of crude. Information from that sector is to the effect that the J. K. Hughes No. 7, Shore, responded to a dose of seven and half quarts of nitro at from 1,291 to 1,361 feet and is making approximately 1,000 barrels of oil. This well passed up a shallower sand.

The McKenna et al No. 5 on the same lease is reported to be making around 900 barrels from the 1,295 to 1,323 foot level. This same syndicate No. 7 well on the same lease is said to be making approximately 400 barrels at from 1.315 to 1,334

Other sections of West Texas in the same area has been suffering from a drouth so far as showing an increase in production. For the past several days reports from the super-visor of the district at Cisco show more dry holes and more wells plugged up than any time within the past months.

It is understood that drilling will be curtailed in Brown county pend-ing the gurations of the crude oil market. Large companies will protect their interests and only where it is absolutely necessary to drill to hold leases or to protect interests by drilling offsets will be drilled.

The truth is that Governor Moore meddles in our customs and religion and persecutes mercilessly those who incur his ire. At the same time has incur his ire. At the same time he is reluctant to take any action against bandits, cattle thieves and murders entrenched in Tulig Gantang and other places during the last two years. He would not even permit the Constabulary patrol to get close to the fortified refuge of these crim-inals. The impression is that Governor Moore has outlived his use-

Friends of the Governor assert that the Princess charges are non-sense and that the real reason behind her rebellion, engineered through her husband, the Datu Tahil, was to gain a perdominant position in Moorland which would enable Tarhata to advance her husband as a candidate for successor to the present Sultan
