

Diversification has never been given a fair chance over much of the state and intensive farming has never, liquid. been practiced to any appreciable de-

But that is the kind of farming that Eastland county and every other county in this section of Texas needs and the uncultivated or semi-cultivated lands of this section of the state should be given an opportunity to produce what they will.

The Texas farmer is not altogether to blame for the situation. Conditions are not of his making. One trouble is that land is too plentiful, and the natural result of this condition is that farmers attempt to cultivate too much land.

There can be little argument to the statement that 40 acres scientifically and intensively cultivated can be made to produce as much as twice that amount under the old methods of farming.
