Tributary Rivers Are Rising for Third Time And Isolating Towns

## HIT BY TORNADO

Iowa and Illinois Are Swept By Storms That Do Heavy Damage

By United Press.

ST. LOUIS, April 20 .- The entire Mississippi basin today was struggling toward relief for the

thousands made homeless by combined flood and storm.

Upward of 30,000 persons have been forced to find homes and at least two score people have been killed as the result of overflowing rivers and death-dealing winds. The property damage has been tremend-ous. The river through this district today continued at flood stage and

today continued at flood stage and several towns are virtually deserted, over a wide area.

The town of Breaton, Illinois, just recovering from the flood waters of last fall was hit again today. Climaxing a week of terror for residents along the Mississippi river and its tributaries, yesterday found tornadoes and driving rain storms doing additional damage throughout the

additional damage throughout the country. Almost a score of cities were in the path of two tornadoes which ripped through Illinois. Early re-

ports indicated that at least 23 persons had been killed.

Some of the wind victims were the ground when the heavy winds smashed their school houses. High winds were general throughout Illinois and Iowa yesterday but reached their greatest force in sections of Iowa, reports show. Trees were torn down, telegraphic communication disrupted and many houses wrecked.

Because of conditions in homa, Kansas, Iowa and Missouri and a continued rise in the Mississippi and tributary rivers, the weather bureau issued new flood warnings today.

It was said that in parts Kansas and Missouri the worst flood conditions in 25 years prevailed as torrents swept away levees, inun-dated countless acres of farm lands and invaded thousands of homes. Many rivers are rising for the third me. Railroad and automobile

# transportation have been entirely cut off in many places. Another Slash At Crude Prices

It is expected now since the price of oil has been slashed again that development work in that area will be slackened up a bit. It is generally conceded that only such development will be begun where it is absolutely necessary to hold the leases and otherwise protect themselves.

The last cut by the Magnolia, which was not met by other companies in this field, was on April 6, when the price on 33 gravity was posted at \$1.05. The cut affects the grade of oil in the Eastland county section 10 cents per barrel, as the price of April was \$1.17 and today's price is \$1.07.


