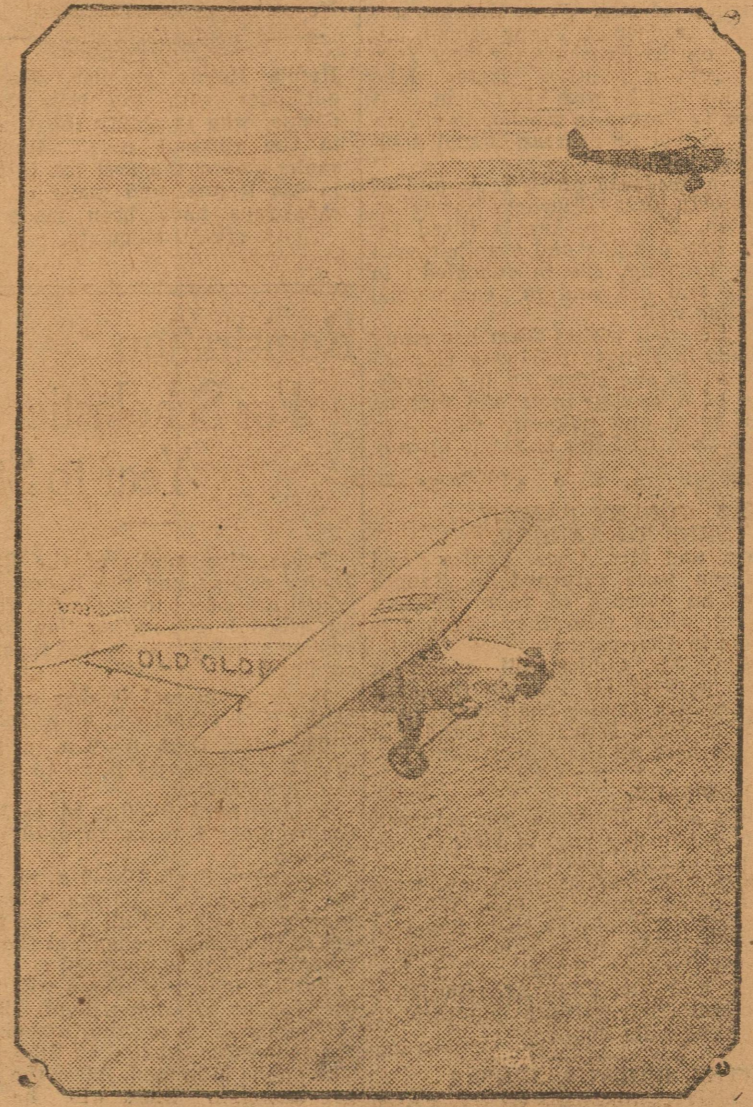
Jury Still Out In Anderson Case At Noon Today

Organization To Promote Better Farm Interests

CORPUS CHRISTI, Sept. 7.—An ambitious plan to enlist 1,000,000 Texas farmers into one gigantic agricultural organization for promoting the interests of the farming industry is under way.
The organization will be perfected at a meeting to be held during the state fair at Dallas next month. R. E. Kleberg of Corpus Christi, president of the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers' association, is temporary chairman of the proposed association.

Headquarters of the association have been set up here pending the meeting at Dallas. Permanent headquarters may be established at San Antonio. A committee composed of representatives of various agricultural organizations in the southwest will complete the organization plans.

According to Kleberg, an intensive drive for members will be launched following the meeting at Dallas. He hopes to enlist at least 1,000,000 of the 2,000,000 farm population of Texas as members.

"The organization will be a non-partisan political organization for the purpose of securing such legislation as will be directly beneficial to agriculture," he said.

"The agricultural industry has been divided into too many groups. There was need for a unified body and we hope to bring this about in order that the entire agricultural industry of the southwest will be working hand in hand."
At first only agricultural producers will be admitted to membership, Kleberg said. Others indirectly connected with farming may be admitted later.

Jitney Dances Three Nights A Week at Cisco

Dance for a jitney will be possible at the dance pavillion at Lake Cisco, on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday nights of each week, beginning on Thursday night, Sept. 8.

Henry Floyd, Gene, Bill and Jack Daniels have leased the hall for those evenings and plan to entertain with these popular dances, which are very much in vogue at other summer resorts and dancing pavillions. The jitney dance plan is on the order of "pay as you dance." One pays ten cents a dance and each time one dances another silver dime, and so on, but there is no admission charge to the hall.

The jitney plan has been used very successfully this summer at the Casito in Fort Worth. It permits the couple who only want to dance one or two dances to enjoy them at a minimum price and on the other hand it permits those who want to dance the whole evening through the same privilege—either way the expense attached is negligible.

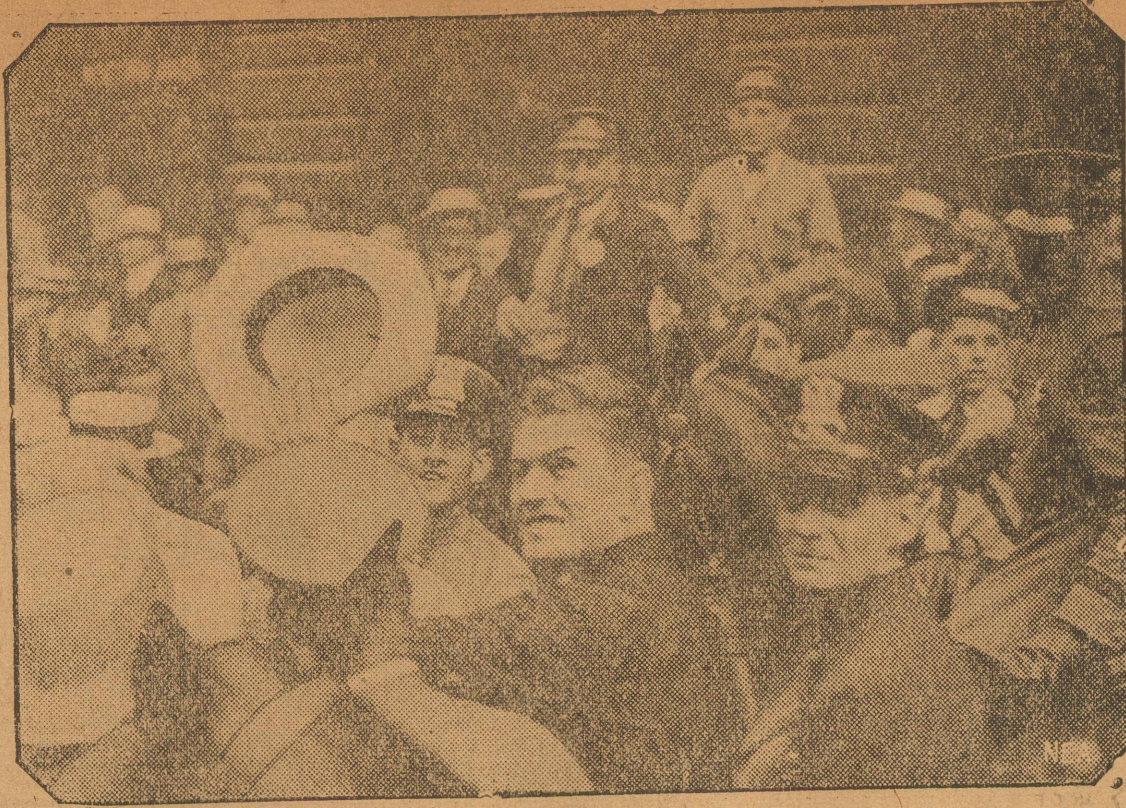
The lineup is not yet available but there'll be several players with the Cats that you'll want to see in action again. The American Legion team is working out and getting in shape to give the Cats a good battle.

Expect 400 Will Enter Golf Play At Big Oil Show

TULSA, Okla., Sept. 7.—Golfers from as far away as New York and Pennsylvania will compete in the golf tournament to be held here in connection with the International Petroleum Exposition here from September 24 to 29.

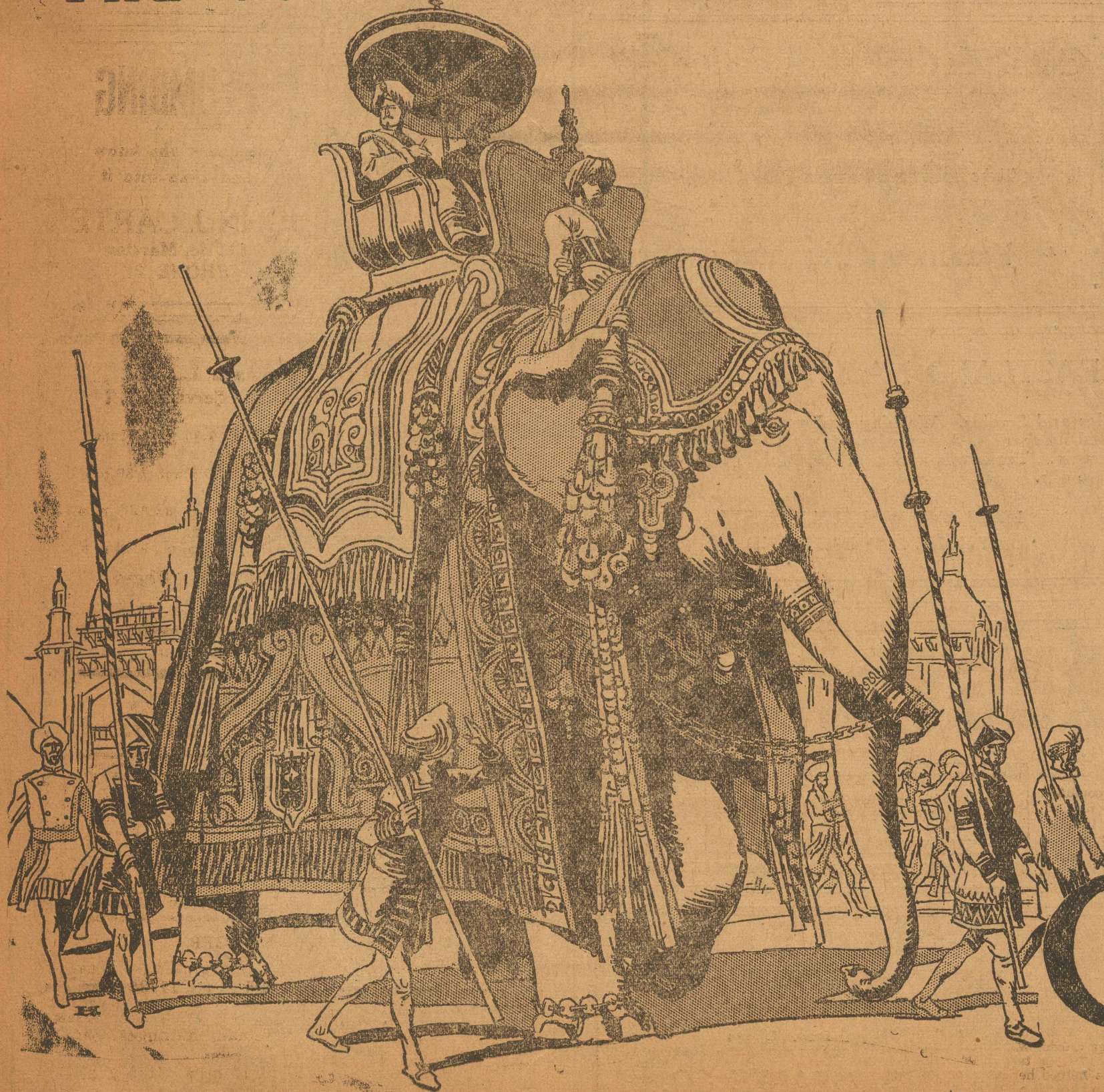

Commission To Stop Parking On South Commerce

The city commission of Ranger passed a resolution at its meeting last night prohibiting the parking of trucks on the block on South Commerce street that lies between Main and Pine streets. He stated yesterday that a way might be provided to heat the water so that swimming could be extended longer into the fall and that ice skating might be possible there this winter, if proper freezing arrangements can be made.
 In the meantime, some definite things are being worked out in the way of benches, tables and picnic comforts for visitors.
 A shower has been arranged for the convenience of those who come out of the pool, and a number of other items installed that add to the comfort of the bathers.
 In speaking of the water treatment, Mr. Kinney stated that the water is carried through a filter, mixed with chlorine gas, and cooled with the various sprays that are featured in the pool. In this way any bacteria that might exist in the water is destroyed. A complete change of the water in the pool is made every six days, he stated.
