A stray cow on the Texas & Pacific right of way near Santo early this morning wrecked the Oil Field Special, due here at 3:32 o'clock, resulting in the death of Archie Gill, 20, bridge worker of Weatherford, and the serious injury of Engineer Hicks and Fireman Schmidt, both of Fort Worth. The locomotive, baggage car and express car left the rails and overturned, plowing up the tracks for some distance. Gill, who was an employe of the road and who was riding in the cab, was scalded to death by live steam. Engineer Hicks was seriously injured in the back and Fireman Schmidt was severely scalded. The locomotive, according to advices received by local officials of the road, overturned when the body of the cow, instead of being tossed aside, became wedged under the trucks at a switch intersection, causing the giant locomotive to topple over, dragging the express and baggage cars The passenger coaches are reported to have remained on the tracks and all passengers to have escaped without injury.





KEEP TO LEFT ON HIGHWAYS, HIKERS TOLD

PORTLAND, Ore., May 15.-Rules of the road for hikers using automobile highways are in existence, though few know it. Each season brings its toll of deaths from motor accidents involving pedestrians that might be avoided by the simple rule of pedestrians keeping to the left on roads outside the city-limits.

Vehicular traffic in the United States follows the universal rule of "traffic to the right." This means that on the right hand side of the road a stream of traffic will be found moving in the direction an observer will face whose right side is towards the right edge of the road.






