## OKLAHOMA GOVERNOR BRANDS DRY LAW A FAILURE; 'STILL ON EACH HILL'

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., May 11.—Enforcement of the prohibition law is a failure.  
Congress slipped up on the country's blind side during the war and put this prohibition legislation over. So says Governor J. B. A. Robertson of Oklahoma, who declared he was a prohibitionist before the Volstead act and that he would never tolerate the open saloon again.  
"Nearly every home in Oklahoma has its own hooch," said the governor. "You can get corn whisky in every county in the state."  
"You can't go on a picnic without some fellow having a load of it on his hip."  
"Jails of the counties of the state are filled with men thrown in for offense against liquor laws."  
"Jails which are not full ought to be."  
"Most sheriffs and county attorneys are trying to enforce the law but people make it faster than peace officers can break it."

OIL CITY, Texas, May 11.—The Detroit-Mexia Oil company's Lynn No. 2, one mile east of Oil City, came in at noon Monday, making an estimated flow of 80,000,000 feet of gas, with the oil content up to this hour constantly increasing. The gas sand was struck at 2,558 feet, the oil sand barely scratched, drilling being discontinued on account of gas pressure. This well was drilled in the remarkably short time of twenty-nine days.

## PEGGY IS ASKED TO QUIT FRANCE, LATEST REPORT

PARIS, May 11.—An amazing report is circulating in high quarters in Paris, to the effect that Peggy Hopkins Joyce has been requested to leave France and not return for twenty years. The request is said to have resulted from a demand made by the Chilean legation on behalf of Mrs. Errazuriz, wife of Wm. Errazuriz, who last week committed suicide at Claridges hotel.  
Judge Merillon of the French appeals court, father of Pierre Merillon, Peggy's former fiance, joined in the appeal, according to the reports.  
Mrs. Errazuriz, mother of the suicide, is said to have stated that Peggy tried to make capital of her son's tragic death.  
Judge Merillon is reported to have threatened to disown Pierre if he traveled to America on the Mauretania, on which Peggy is a passenger. So Pierre is leaving on the Aquitania next Saturday.  
All these statements which are flying about Paris absolutely lack confirmation from any official source. Paul Vallembrasa, Maurice, the dancer, and others admitted hearing of the matter. The French minister of the interior denied knowing anything about the matter.  
"It is a ridiculous libel," said Henri Letellier, who is said to have won Peggy's consent to marriage. "Peggy will be back in June."  
The Chilean legation is mute. Mrs. Errazuriz has returned to London.

**RELIEF SUPPLIES TO BE CARRIED WITHOUT CHARGE**  
The American Railway Express company will furnish free transportation on all donated clothing and other supplies to flood sufferers in the states of Mississippi, Louisiana and Arkansas, it was announced this morning by C. E. Shields, manager of the local office.  
All such supplies, however, must be consigned to organized and recognized relief committees, it is stated.
