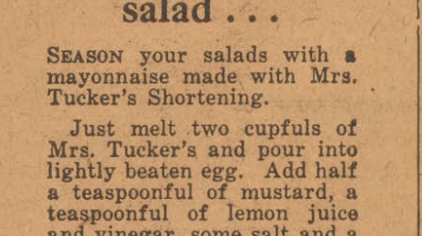

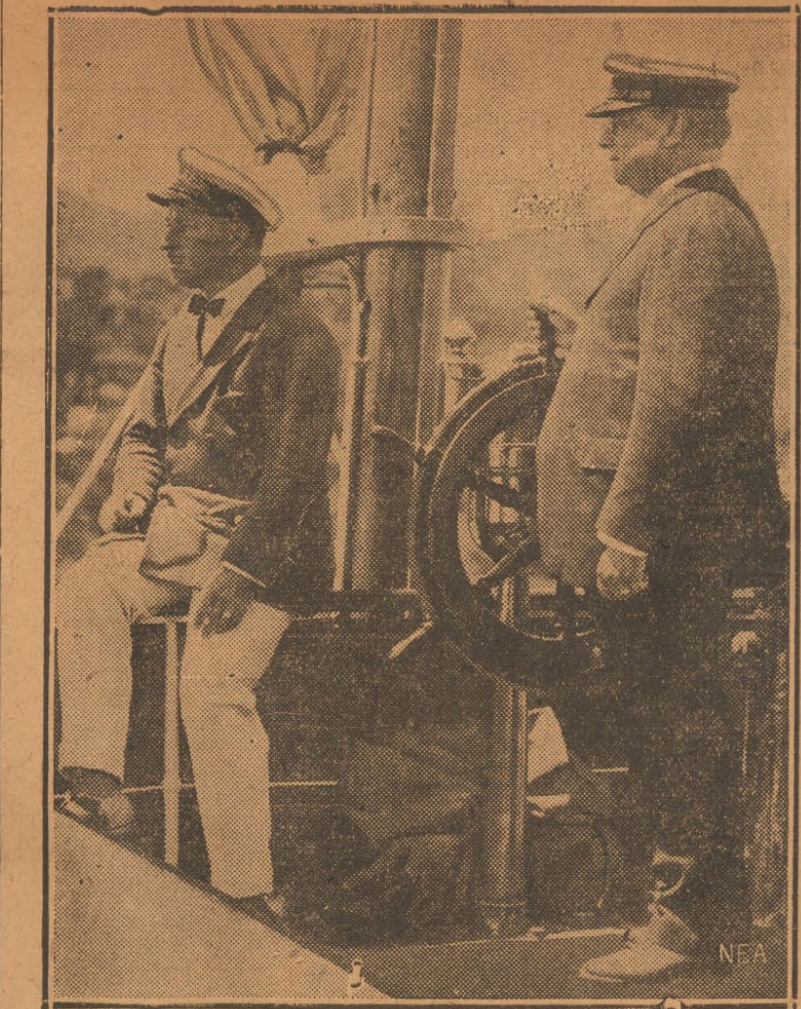

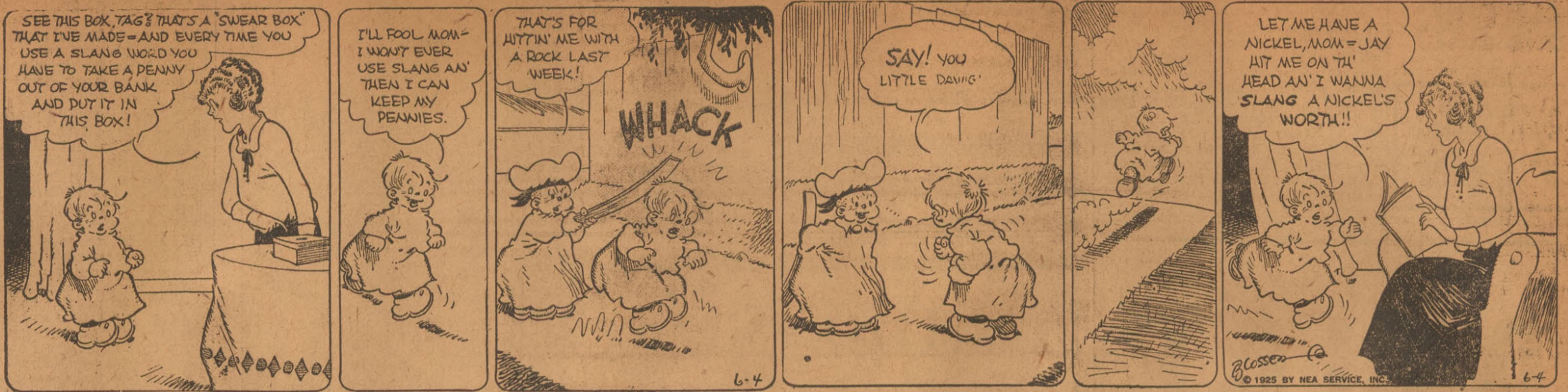

## Girl Burned to Death, Two Others Seriously Injured

**HAMILTON, Texas, June 4.**—Special Correspondence.  
Mary Ann Moore, 8-year-old daughter of Grover Moore, was burned to death, and the latter's young niece, Quilata Smith of Hico, Hamilton county, was burned, probably fatally, in a blaze that destroyed the Moore home near Hico at midnight Tuesday. Moore and his wife were injured seriously.

The family awakened to find that the fire had cut off all exits in the house. Moore finally succeeded in getting out his invalid wife through a window, at the same time awakening her nurse, who was in an adjoining room. The nurse escaped through the same window without injury.

Returning for the children, Mr. Moore succeeded in rescuing his niece after the latter had been burned critically, but could not find his daughter and got out of the blazing home just before the roof fell in.

The fire was of undetermined origin.
