MEMPHIS, May 9.*—With the known dead placed at 22, a government crew today attempted to raise the hull of the engineering boat Norman, which sank in the Mississippi river, 15 miles below here last night. If the attempt is not successful a diver will try to breat into the submerged cabin and take out the bodies believed to have been trapped in the vessel.

The government boat, Choctaw, which accompanied the Norman on its ill-fated expedition was equipped with derricks and grappling irons and ordered back to the scene to try to raise the hull.

Only five bodies had been recovered at noon. An official list of 22 was issued. Another list compiled by members of the party shows four more still unaccounted for.

The steamboat was on an inspection trip carrying 40 civil engineers and sank near Lakeview, Miss. The engineers were attending the convention of the American Association of Civil Engineers, in session here, and had gone to inspect the Mississispip river revetment work.
