# PRITCHARD NO. 1 WELL DEVELOPS DRILLED IN RANGER TERR

Ranger's oil boom is assuming definite proportions with the increased production of Pritchard No. 1, located about seven miles northwest of Ranger, owned by G. C. Barkley and associates. Averaging above 3,800 barrels daily with the pulling of the tools and drilling four feet deeper into the pay formation,

Blowing in for an estimated flow of 2,500 barrels with the tools in the hole, the Pritchard well steadied and TWO MEN SHOT hole, the Pritchard well steadied and dropped to 1,600 barrels, where the production remained steady with the oil flowing by heavy heads and spraying continually. A two-inch pipe line, hurriedly rushed to the wall by the Prairie Oil & Gas company sufficed to take care of the needs of the well temporarily. needs of the well temporarily. A four-inch line was laid and connected up to the storage tanks several Drive Ahead After Hitting Boy, days ago.

The tools were pulled Thursday and it was then discovered that the bit had been lost. Work of fishing for the bit started and it was pulled out Friday morning, the hole then being drilled four feet deeper into the pay formation resulted in an unusually heavy flow of oil. A gauge of the oil was said to register 150 barrels per hour as a conservative estimate, and experienced drillers say the well is making closer to Marvin McCloud and Jack Smith

The well is said to be the largest ever brought in adjacent to Ranger and closely approaches the record well brought in at Desdemona.

Oil in the new pool is of the highest test gravity that draws the top price for crude today, testing 40.6 degrees Baume gravity. Price for 40 degrees and above is \$2.25.

New locations are being made by several of the independent operators who have leases in that territory. Preparations are being rushed in order to start drilling as soon as posorder to start drilling as soon as pos-

As a result of the bringing in of the Barkley well, Ranger is filling up with oil men from everywhere and all are jubilant over the in-creased production of the well. Leasing is active, with many trying to get in on the pool proper. 




