Story of the Shooting Is Related by Them; Defense Corroborated

Ttestifying in his own behalf this morning in the Ninety-first district court where he is being tried for the murder of Luther Browder, who was shot to death on the streets of Cisco early last July, Charlie Basham de-clared that he killed Browder in selfdefense after he had been told by friends that Browder had threatened his life and after he saw Browder stop his car suddenly when he saw him on the street and reach for his

car-pocket.

John Brown, Tom Mashburn, and Marshall Broyles, Basham said, had told him that Browder had told them that if he learned that Basham was the party who tipped his bank account to Clay Dunn he was going to kill him. He also said that John Brown, on the morning of the killing, told him that Browder had told him that he had found out that Basham

Corroborated. Basham's testimony was brought out following that given by Brown,



STOCKHOLM. - A share of the royal jewels belonging to the late Dowager Queen Louise of Denmark, as well as part of her private for-tune, reckoned as one of the largest in Europe, has now been inherited by her daughter, Princess Ingeborg of Sweden, who in turn is mother of

Some of these jewels of which Princess Astrid will some day inherit her share, were orginally part of the Swedish Court collection, having been taken out of the country when the late owner, who was daughter of King Charles XV of Sweden, married Crown Prince Frederick of Denmark, and thus became queen of that

mark, and thus became queen of that country. Had not the Swedish constitution followed the Salic Law and forbidden the succession to women. Princess Louise would have been the ruler of Sweden, instead of her un-

cle, Oscar II, father of the present king, Gustav V.

The mother of Queen Louise, was a Dutch Princess and it was from her that the bulk of the fortune now distributed was derived. Some of the jewels were similarly obtained and others were engagement and wedding

others were engagement and wedding presents, including a pearl collier from the Khedive of Egypt.

Throughout her life, Quee Louise was regarded as fabulously rich and she was also very charitable. "I know I am called wealthy" she used to say. "The truth is that I have eight millions—I also have eight children."

Two of her sons are now the rul-ing monarchs of Denmark and Nor-way, and in their behalf she spent money generously. The lion's share of the estate went to King Christian of Denmark and Queen Alexandrina inherited the grand diadem from her mother-in-law, but the remainder was distributed in eight shares according to appraised value.

PLYMOUTH, Eng.—One of the last of England's "wooder wall" of sailing ships, the old Implacable, a veteran of the Trafalgar victory, has sailed her last voyage, but she will still serve the King as a training-ship for English Sea Scouts.





# your sons will fondly remember

I DON'T know why almost every man recalls his mother's cooking by the doughnuts she used to make—but he does.

Doughnuts seem to be one sure way to the heart of every boy from six to sixty.

Here are three of my favorite recipes for doughnuts about which your sons will tell their sons with fond recollection. Deep fried in Crisco they are rich, yet digestible—never a bit greasy.

Winifed Startes

#### Doughnuts

1/3 cup sugar 11/2 tablespoons Crisco 1 egg

2 teaspoons baking 1/8 teaspoon cinnamon

1/8 teaspoon clove 1/3 cup milk 2 cups flour 1 teaspoon mace ½ teaspoon salt

Cream sugar and Crisco together. Add well beaten egg and milk and mix well. Mix and sift flour, baking powder, cinnamon, clove, mace and salt. Add to the first mixture and mix thoroughly. Turn out on slightly floured board and roll to ½ inch thickness. Cut with a doughnut cutter and fry in deep hot Crisco (340 to 375 degrees F.) until a delicate brown. Drain on unglazed paper. Sprinkle with confectioners' sugar before serving.

This recipe makes 24 doughnuts.

#### Raised Doughnuts

3/3 cup sugar 1 teaspoon salt 1 cup scalded 2 eggs

1 yeast cake 2 tablespoons lukewarm water 5 cups flour

1 teaspoon nutmeg Add sugar, Crisco and salt to the scalded milk. When lukewarm add the yeast cake

mixed with warm water. Add enough flour to make a sponge (about 2 cups). Set in a warm place to rise. When light add well beaten eggs, nutmeg and enough flour to make a soft dough. Cover and let rise until double in bulk. Knead until free from large

Roll out on a slightly floured board to 1/2 inch thickness. Cut with a doughnut cutter, cover and set in a warm place to rise again until double in bulk. Put them top side down in the deep hot Crisco (340 to 375 degrees F.) Fry on one side, turn and fry on the other side. When a delicate brown remove from fat and drain on unglazed paper. Just before serving sprinkle with confectioners' sugar. This recipe makes 30 doughnuts.

#### Jelly Doughnuts

Follow recipe for Raised Doughnuts. After the second rising, roll out on a slightly floured board to 1/3 inch thickness. Cut with a cooky cutter. Put one teaspoon currant jelly in the center of one round, moisten edges with water and place another round on top. Press edges lightly together. Cover and set in a warm place to rise until double in bulk. Fry in the same way as Raised




