



C. of C. Campaign to Put Ranger at Head of List

Ranger is out for a world's record, with every prospect of making it.

Reference has been made several times in the preparations for the expansion and reorganization campaign of the Chamber of Commerce to the fact that if the drive nets at least 2,000 members who, at \$25 per year, will provide an income of not less tian \$50,000, Ranger will lead every other-city, in the United States and Canada in the per-capita support of its eivic commercial organization.

Examination today of the records proves that this will be true. The per-capita support in Ranger will not only be larger than that of any other city, but it will exceed the best figures elsewhere by about 50 per cent. It is true that fir two places in this country, the amount of money available for Chamber of Commerce purposes is larger than it will be in Ranger, but this fact is explained by the existence of so-called sustaining funds, which are wholly in addition to the regular incomes of the chambers. Both of these towns are quite small, under 4,000 population, and the sustaining funds were created for special purposes.




