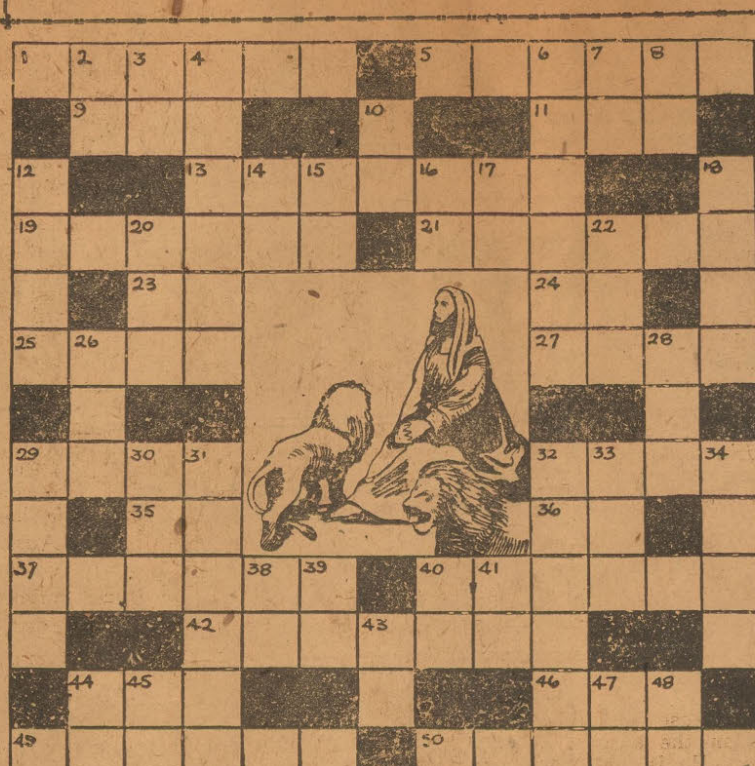

**RANGER TAKES TOURIST PARK**

City Commissioners Will Run Camp Grounds Now

The tourist park in Ranger, established and maintained through efforts of the Ranger Lions, yesterday was taken over by the Ranger city commission, the city assuming responsibility hereafter for its upkeep. A committee from the Lions club, Dr. H. A. Logsdon, Dr. C. C. Craig, and C. C. Patterson, presented the matter to the commission. Dr. Logsdon pointed out that the tourist park had been a fine asset for Ranger, being known as the best free park in West Texas. He said the average upkeep in the summer time was \$10 monthly, which included sanitary service, this being possible because the gas and electric companies permitted the minimum charge for gas and electricity so long as the park was free to tourists, who are expected to remain not longer than two days. The committee reported to the commission this minimum charge would be continued after the city took the park over so long as tourists were permitted free use of it, and on motion by Commissioner Teal the city assumed management and control of the park.

The park is on West Main street at the junction of the road ascending Eastland hill. It was established by the Ranger Lions, who constructed a rock rest room and had it provided with sanitary arrangements, water and gas, permitted all tourists free use of the park and its conveniences for two days and nights.

**COLEMAN FIREMEN ARE READY FOR CISCO MEET**

COLEMAN, April 1.—Delegates have been selected by the Coleman fire department to attend the annual state firemen's convention to be held at Cisco, May 12, 13 and 14. Fire Marshal E. A. King and W. T. Moore, manager of the local telephone exchange, were named as delegates. The Coleman department expects to enter a racing team. E. G. Dalton has been selected as assistant fire chief.

**FOREST FIRES RAGE IN BASTROP'S HILLS**

BASTROP, April 1.—Forest fires in the pine hills, a mile east of Bastrop, have been raging for the past two weeks and considerable damage is being done. Valuable pine timber is being destroyed by the fire as well as numbers of acres of pasture areas. All tourists are being warned as much as possible to extinguish all fires they may leave in the pine woods.

**SNYDER BEAUTIFYING COURTHOUSE GROUNDS**

SNYDER, Tex., April 1.—Actual work on paving the public square here has been begun. The gutting has been placed around the courtyard lawn and part of the sidewalks. The sidewalks are to be 12 feet wide. The paving is to have a concrete base and be topped with brick.

**Oklahoman Receives Second Flogging In Booze Investigations**

OKEMAH, Okla., April 1.—Four of his neighbors are in jail here charged with the abduction and flogging of L. S. Lewellen, 35. It was the second time Lewellen has been the victim of floggers. He was taken from his home, stripped of his clothing, bound to a tree and beaten with a leather strap. Lewellen said he had been warned to sell his farm and leave the community. He is said to have testified several weeks ago at a court of inquiry investigating liquor violations. Information against the four men under arrest has been sworn to by Lewellen, who said he recognized them when their masks slipped from their faces in the struggle. Lewellen is said by his physicians to be in a critical condition.

**AGGIES STOCK SHOW CHAMPS**

Texas A. & M. Student Supremacy at Recent Exhibition

COLLEGE STATION.—The supremacy of A. & M. methods of producing livestock, employed for the primary purpose of training the future cattlemen of Texas, was proved in the show ring at the fat stock show in Fort Worth. The college won 12 first prizes in the 14 classes entered with its steers; eight first out of 14 classes entered with its hogs; six first out of seven classes entered with its horses; besides having grand champion steer over all breeds in the show; half the individual and pen championships in hogs; championship in both kinds of horses exhibited and a number of second prizes in all divisions. The champion steer was sold for \$395 after winning \$100 in prizes. The college won a total of \$1,068 in prizes. Other honors were the winning of first place by the cattle and judging teams over other southern college teams.

**Seymour C. C. Lets \$75,000 Hotel Job**

SEYMOUR, Tex., April 1.—E. A. Newman has signed a contract with the Chamber of Commerce, the former agreeing to build a 50-room, fireproof hotel here to cost about \$75,000. It is to be located just north of the new city hall. All the rooms are to have hot and cold water and some will have baths. It is expected it will be ready to open next fall.

**Abilene Building Is Ahead of March, 1924**

ABILENE, April 1.—Building in Abilene for March reached a total of \$61,405, which was slightly ahead of the record for March of last year. Building permits have been issued in Abilene so far this year totaling \$290,925, which is slightly over the total for the first three months of 1924.

**School Election Interest Growing**

Dr. L. C. G. Buchanan and F. E. Langston have filed with J. M. Dodson, business agent for the Ranger independent school district, their applications for places on the ticket at the election next Saturday to name four school trustees. They make six in the race, Dr. Albert Duffer, Mills Davenport, Lee Williams and C. D. Chastain having filed previously. Dr. Buchanan was among those first suggested this year as a school trustee, but it was thought he would refuse to be a candidate because his daughter, a teacher in the High school, would be barred by the nepotism law from teaching there while he was a member of the board. But Miss Buchanan, it is understood, will go away next year to take a post-graduate course, so there will be no reason why Dr. Buchanan should not serve, and his friends saw to it the filing was made. Like Mr. Chastain, Dr. Buchanan is a college degree man.

Mr. Langston was urged two years ago to be a candidate for school trustee, because of his well known interests in the schools, but would not do so. He is in the race this year, and is expected to run well. 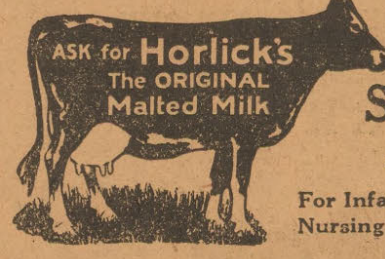
