Jurors at Variance on Many Angles of Case

WICHITA FALLS, March 26 .-Possibility that the jury deliberating over the fate of former Mayor Frank Collier for the slaying of his 19-year-old son-in-law, Elzie Robertson may not reach an agreement developed today. Advices to Trial Judge P. A. Martin indicated some of the jurors were at variance some issues of the case and that it was not likely an agreement could be reached.

Judge Martin ordered the jury to attempt to smooth cut its differences. Deliberation started at 8 o'clock this morning.

"If you believe the homicide to be murder, not manslaughter, then the defendant should be sent to the electric chair or to a felon's cell."




