#### Lenten Season Luncheon Dishes

(By Barbara Brooks, Kellogg Company, Battle Creek, Mich.) Lenten season always gives us a good excuse for serving the many interesting dishes which we are inclined to forget during the rest of the year. Our imaginations are stimulated to extra effort in preparing well seasoned and appetizing food which will both nourish and please the members of our fami-

Have you ever made Creole rice First, cook the rice so that it will be fluffy and white. The easiest way is to follow the Chinese method. Put two cups of rice, four cups of water, and two teaspoons of salt into the top part of a double boiler, and cook over the direct flame for 10 minutes, then steam over hot water for 10 minutes or longer. When the rice is thoroughly cooked there will be no water to pour off and ever ygrain of rice will be dis-

In a saucepan melt two table-spoons of shortening and in it cook two sliced onions, one shredded green pepper, and one pimento. Add the rice and mix well and season with paprika, chili powder and salt if necessary. Pack the rice mixture into a bowl which has been butter-The rice can be unmolded onto a platter and served with a cheese a platter and served with a cheese sauce. The cheese sauce is made by melting two tablespoons of butter and mixing it with two tablespoons of flour, one-half teaspoon of salt and a dash of paprika. Add one cup of milk and cook until well blended and smooth, then add one-half cup of grated cheese. of grated cheese

In every meal we need fuel, building and regulating foods. The rice gives fuel, the milk and cheese building material. We must serve something with the Creole rice which will add regulating substances. A green salad and bran muffins will do this. Prepare the muffins by creaming to-gether two tablespoons of bacon fat and four tablespoons of sugar. Add one egg and beat well. Add one cup of all bran, one cup of buttermilk, and one cup of flour, sifted with one half teaspoon of soda, one teaspoon of baking powder and one-half tea-spoon of salt. Bake the muffins in a moderate ove nfor about 20 min-

At this time of year lettuce, romaine, chicory, or dandelion greens may be used for salad. A delicious dressing can be easily prepared by mashing the hard cooked yolks of two eggs in a bowl and adding oil and vinegar until you have a dress ng of the right consistency. Season the dressing with salt, paprika, choped chives, and catsup or chili sauce. The whites of the eggs may be chopped and used in a sauce to be serve with fish at another meal, or the whites and yolks may be separated before being cooked and the yolks cooked in boiling water and the uncooked whites saved for frosting or for a meringue for pie or pudding.




