Celebration of the Fourth of July yesterday cost approximately 75 persons their lives and injuries to more than 600, chiefly children, according to figures obtained in a nation-wide survey conducted by the United Press. Of these deaths, 12 were caused directly by fireworks, 17 by drowning, 41 by automobile accidents and the others were miscellaneous.

At noon today reports were continuing to come in from isolated districts, indicating that the total number of deaths may run above 100. Fireworks caused injuries to 173 persons and automobile accidents to more than 154

## Municipal Hall Acquired, Be Occupied Soon

Property at Pine and Austin Streets Purchased From Republic Supply Company for \$17,500 and Will Be Remodeled for Administration, Police and Fire. Only Small Portion of Bond Money Will Be Needed.

Negotiations for the purchase of the Republic Supply company building at Pine and Austin streets, to be used as a city hall building, were practically completed yesterday by the city commissioners. The abstract has been sent for and will be examined by City Attorney Milton T. Lyman. The purchase price, according to Mayor Hodges, is \$17,500. This is \$2,500 less than the original amount asked for by the Republic company's attorney and secretary, A. B. Judd, who has been in Ranger two days in connection with the transaction.

The police and fire departments and all of the administrative offices will be located on the first floor of the building, Mayor Hodges said.

All of the commissioners except Dr. C. O. Terrell, who is in Chicago, are firmly in accord with the proposition of acquiring the building, the mayor said. 




