WASHINGTON, Jan. 2.—Despite an increase in the production of grain in the United States in 1925, the gross value of the crop was \$708,000,000 less than in 1924, the agricultural department announced to-cay. The gross value in 1925 was \$3,810,713,000 compared with \$4,-518,716,000 the previous year.






