All business houses having an alley entrance are supposed to load and unload at the rear entrance, it is said, and with automobiles of prisaid, and with automobiles of private parties parked in the entranceways trucks cannot get through, necessitating blocking of Main street as they load and unload.

A fire hazard is also created through the blocking of the alleys as the fire trucks make their down.
