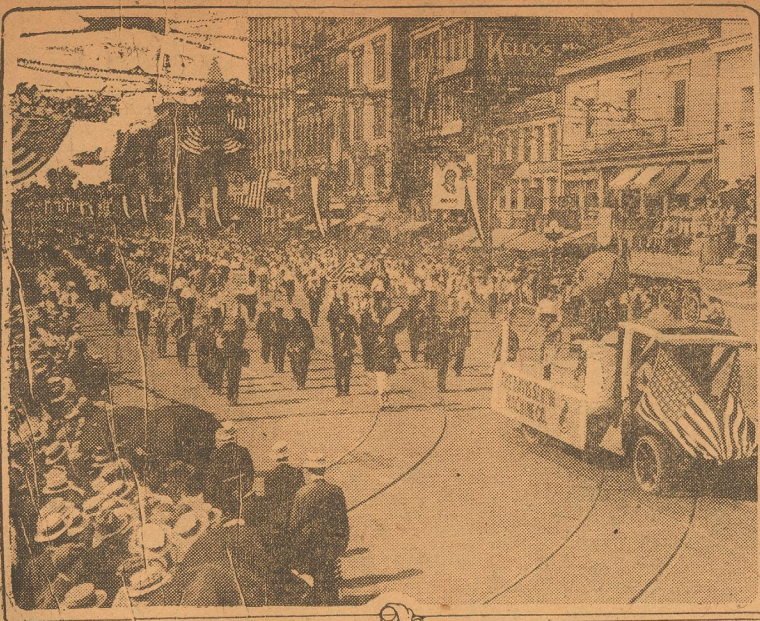

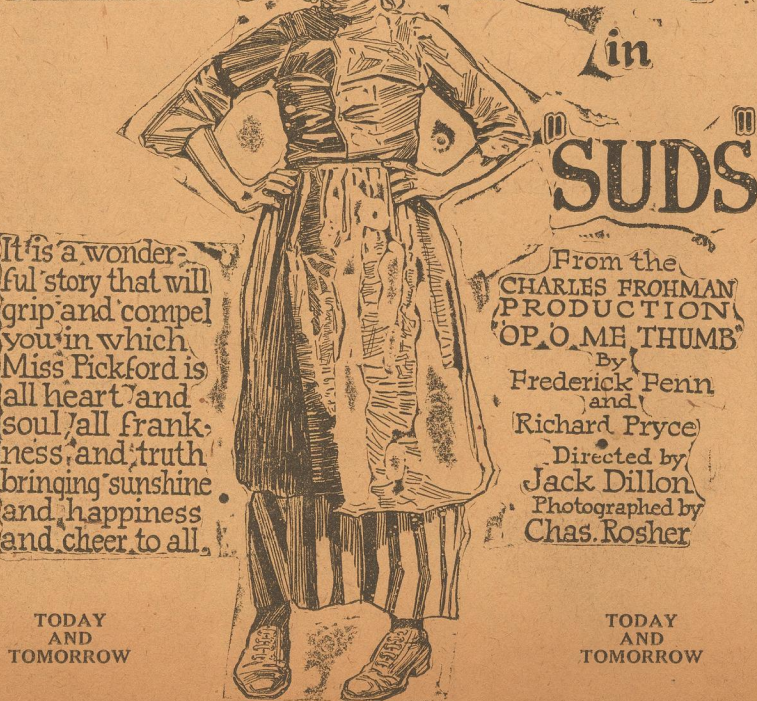

PRICE IS PLACED ON DIRT TO COVER SAND IN INDIANA

By Associated Press. GARY, Ind., Aug. 7.—"Dirt cheap" has long lost its meaning in Gary, where the cost of covering the native sand with soil is estimated to date at \$1,000,000.

Approximately 500,000 cubic yards of earth have been brought in here, according to recent estimates. Lowlands adjacent to the city have contributed generously but for years it has been necessary to cross the Illinois state line to bring in dirt by rail from Joliet and Plainfield.

The price of dirt is an item seriously considered by the prospective home builder here. Black loam has risen to \$3 a cubic yard and the average cost of surfacing a lot is around \$200.

Sometimes a poor batch of material has been brought in from marshes and spread over thin by an economical householder, to find that in the hot summer suns his front yard is burning up.

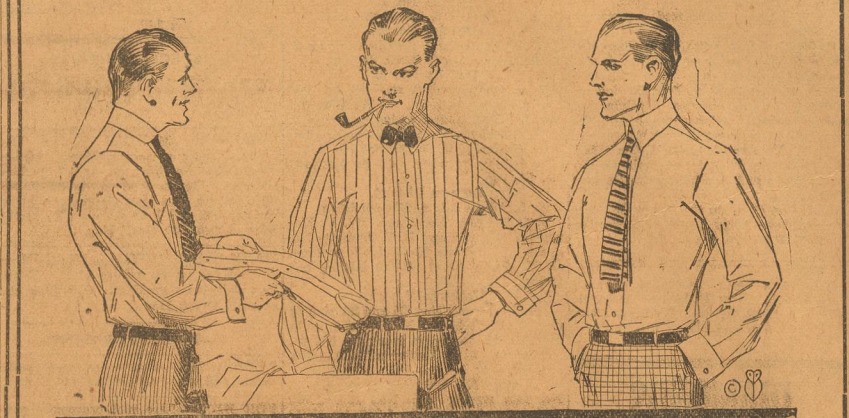

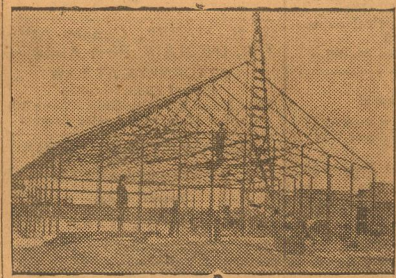
